While world continues to cry aloud

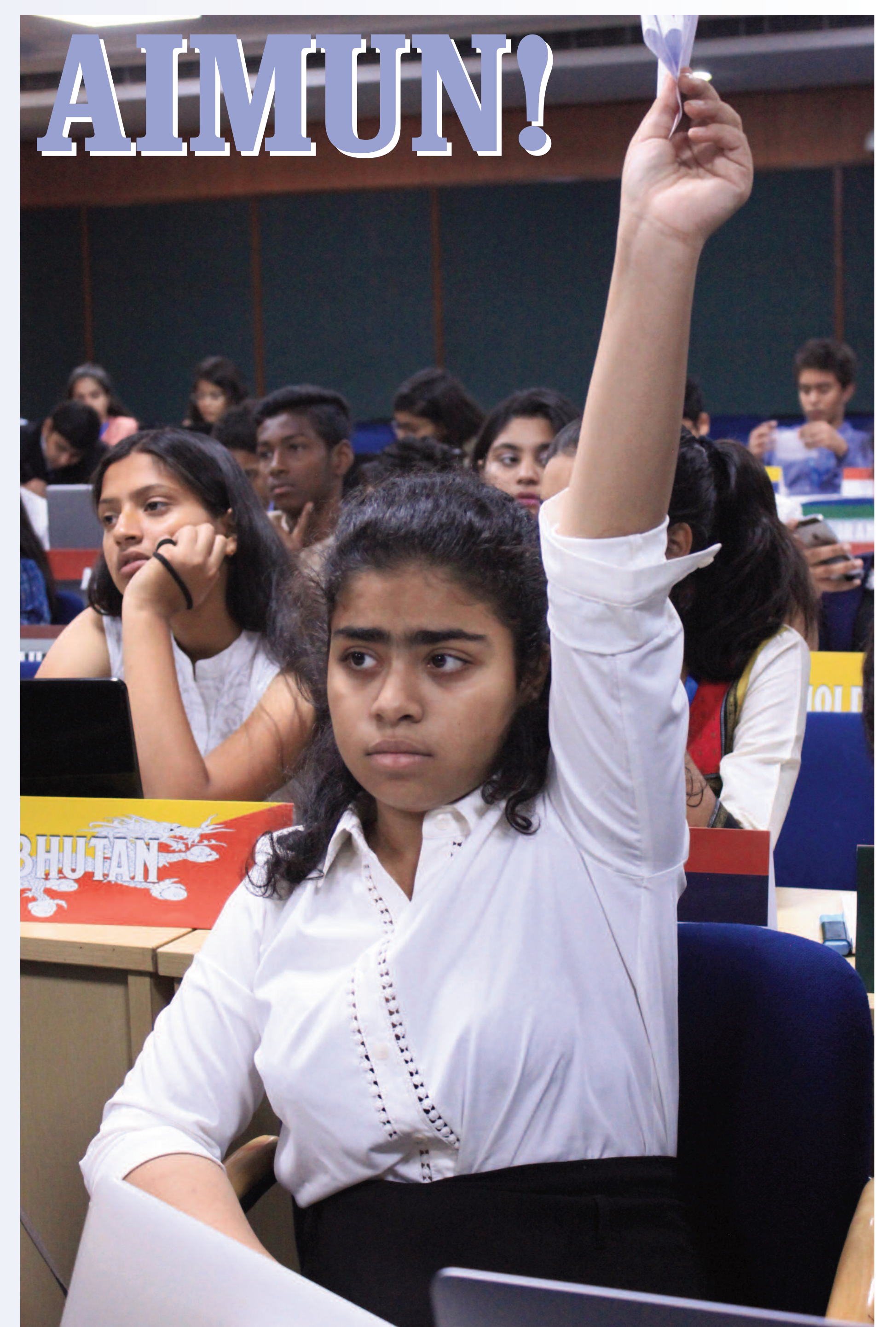

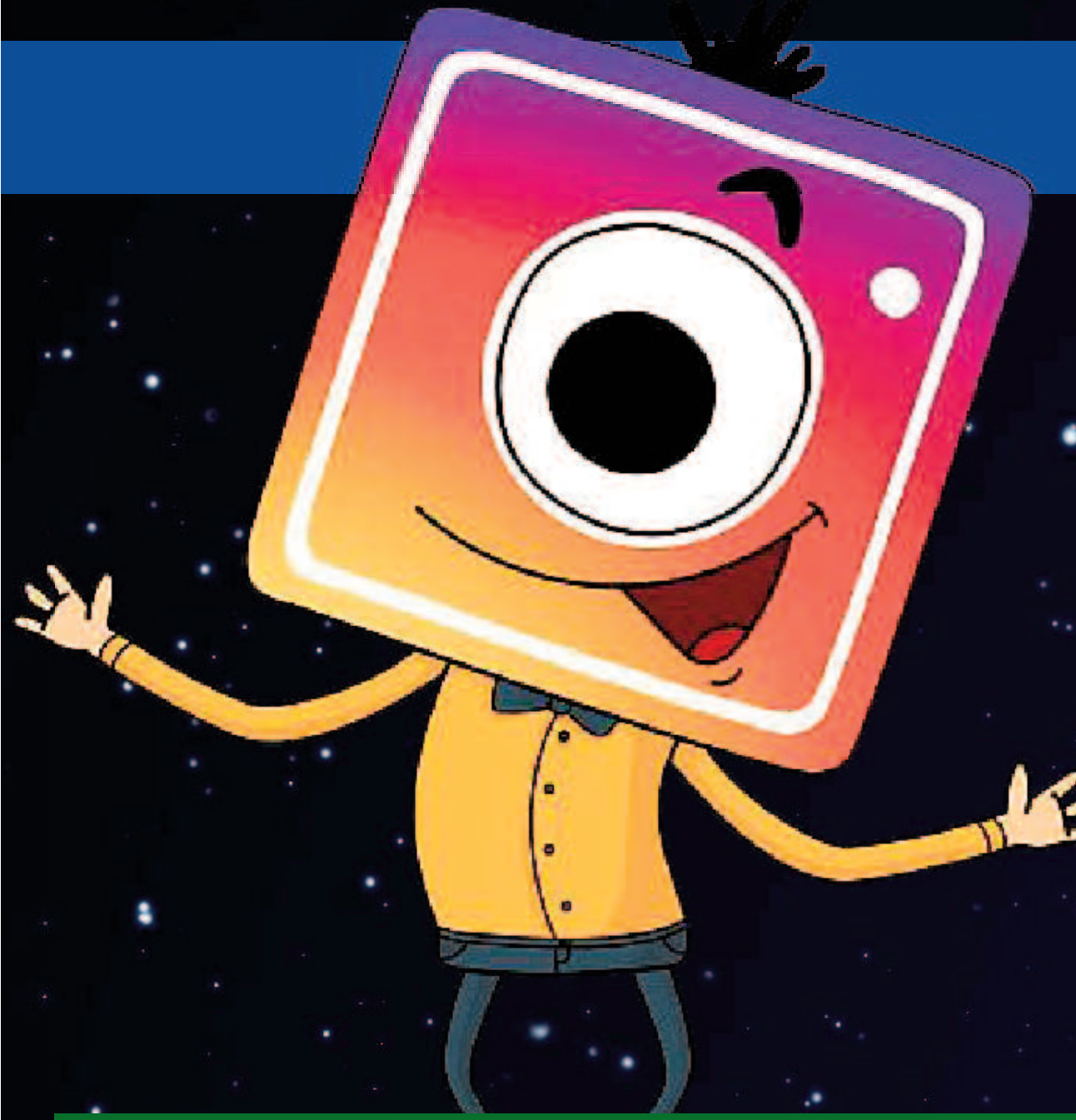

This delegate is more focused on clicking their selfies and making reels than the actual discussion of the committee. Yes, even in an virtual MUN.

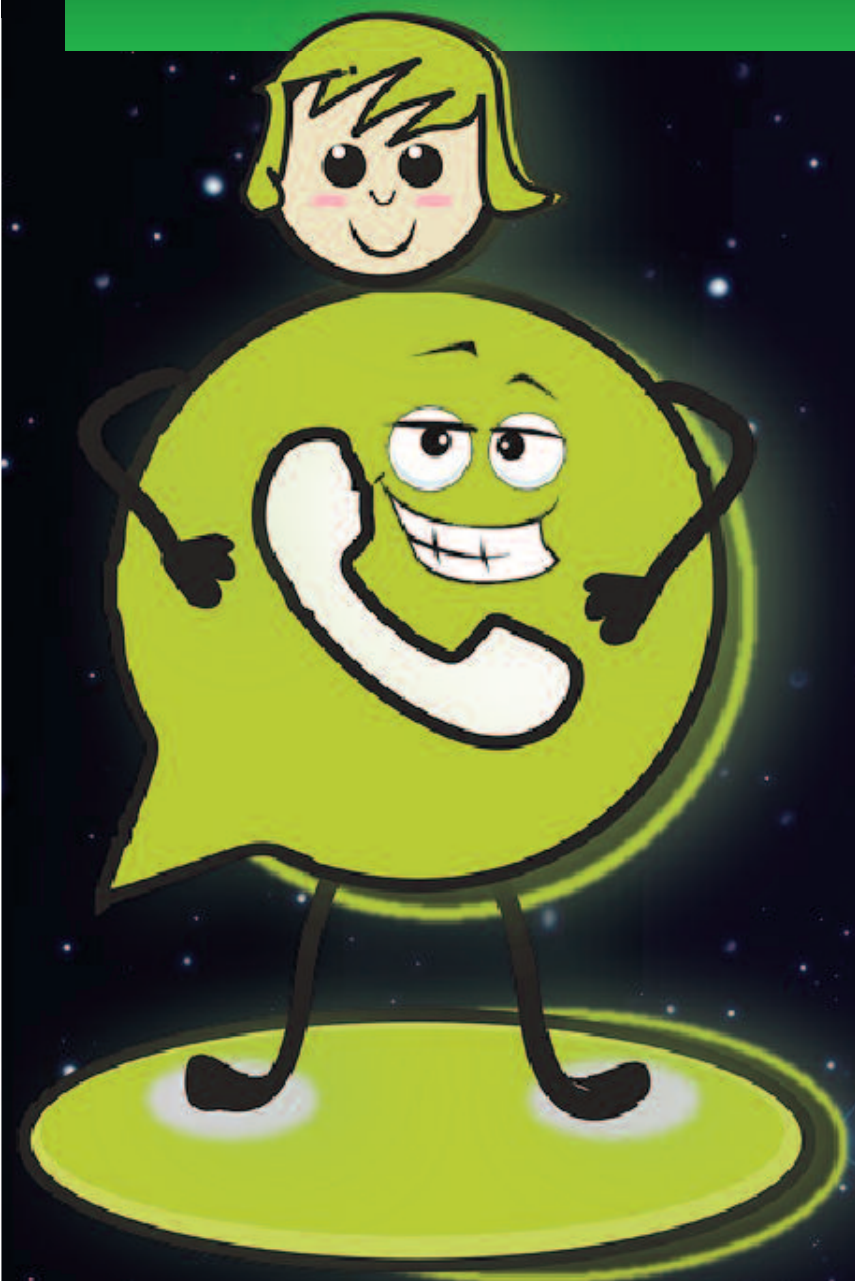

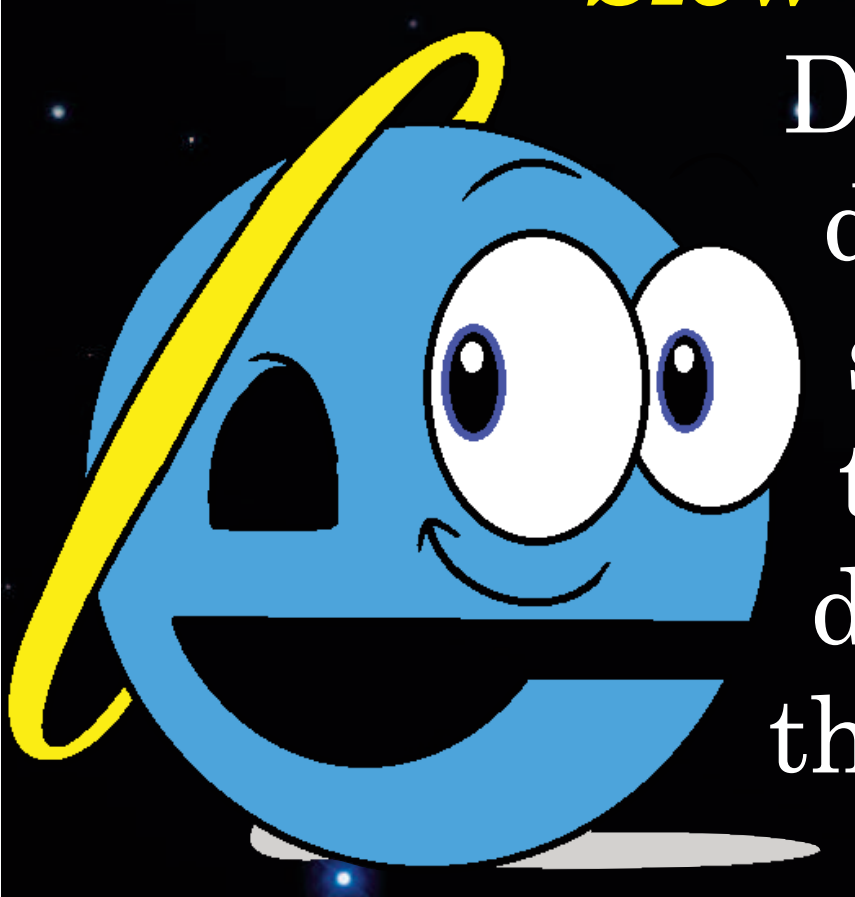

Are you sad that you're missing out on visiting India?

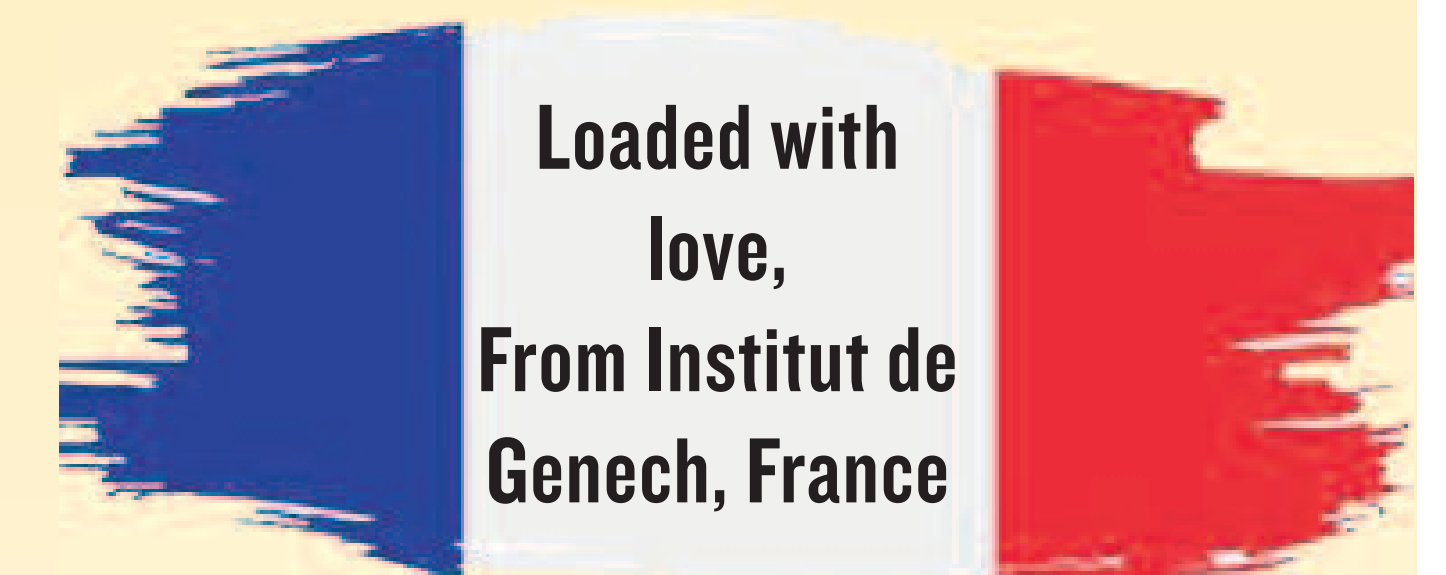
Unfortunately, we have to be a part of this event virtually this time, but we would definitely like to visit India once the pandemic is over.
