OUR STUDENTS VISIT BLIND SCHOOL

In order to sharpen the sensitivity of our students towards the physically challenged, a visit to 'Captain Chandan Lal Special Middle School for The Blind', Behrampur, was organized for students of Grade 8. Our students visited the school campus and were inspired by the grit and will- to- win of the visually impaired students.

Our students interacted with the students of grade 8 and learnt about Tailor Frame designed by Simon Tailor which they used to solve Mathematical problems. They used the Braille typewriter (brailier) for other subjects designed by Perkins. Their books were printed in Braille script

They read fluently by touching the dots from their Braille scripted NCERT books. We were amazed to find out that Braille could not only be written for just English but also for other languages such as Hindi, Sanskrit etc. The students visited the Computer Room where the children were occupied in their daily lessons. They worked on the Microsoft Software 'JAWS' which allowed them to read the screen with its Text-to-Speech output. They used the 'NVDA' Software for Hindi. The use of advanced technology in teaching learning process was appreciable and meeting them was a great inspiration indeed.

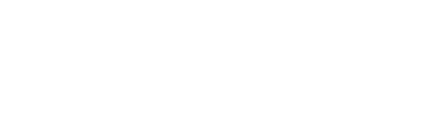
