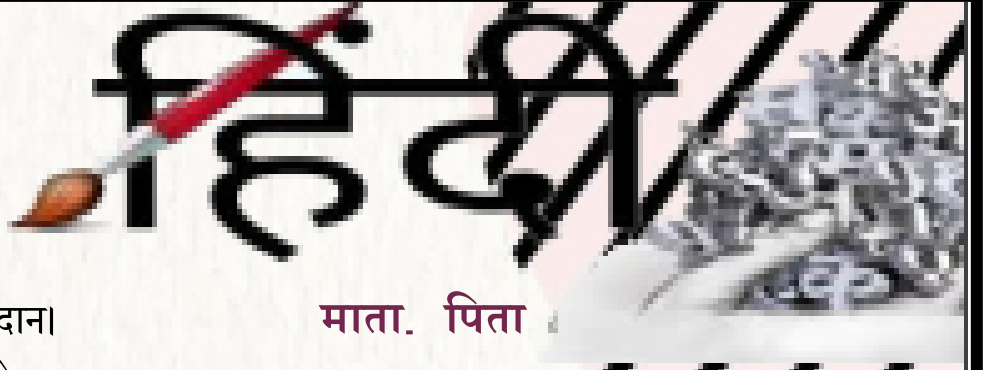

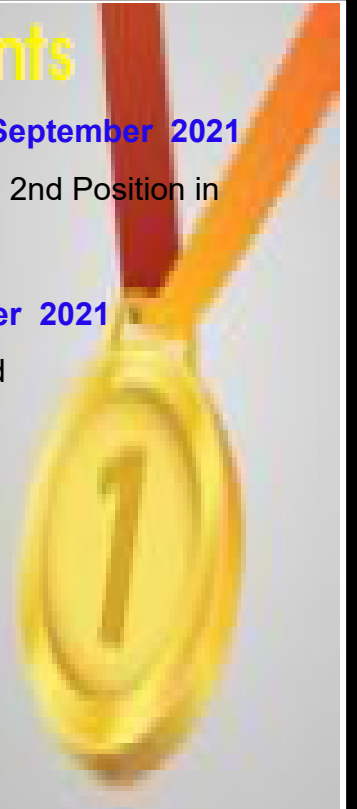

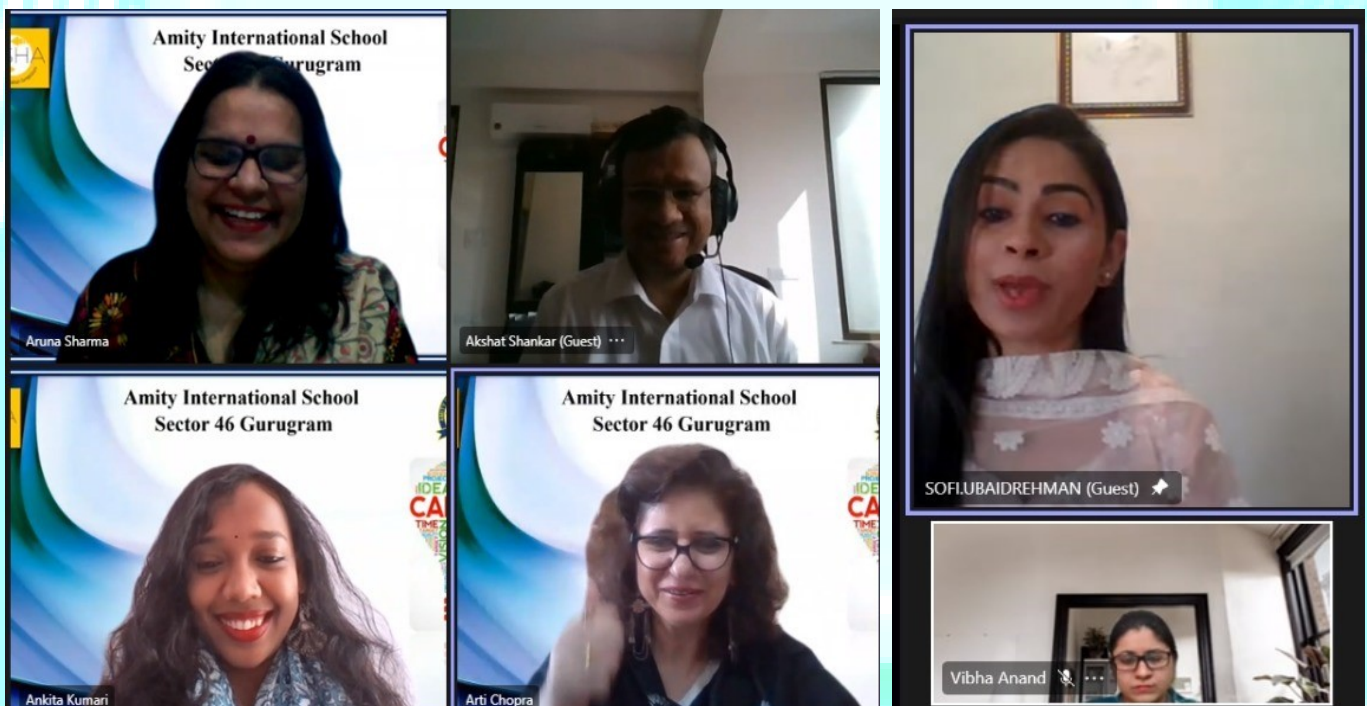

## DISHA' 2021—A CAREER ORIENTATION SYMPOSIUM

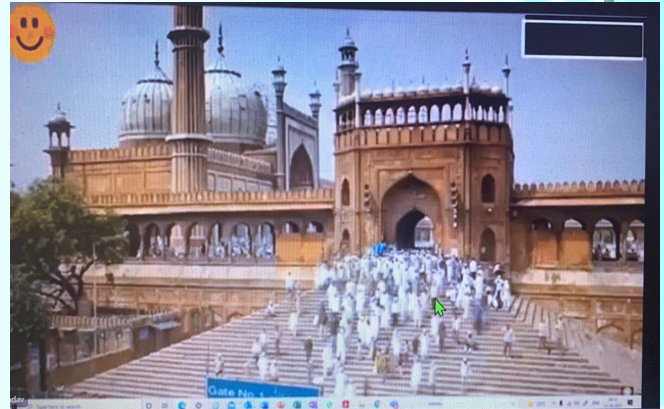

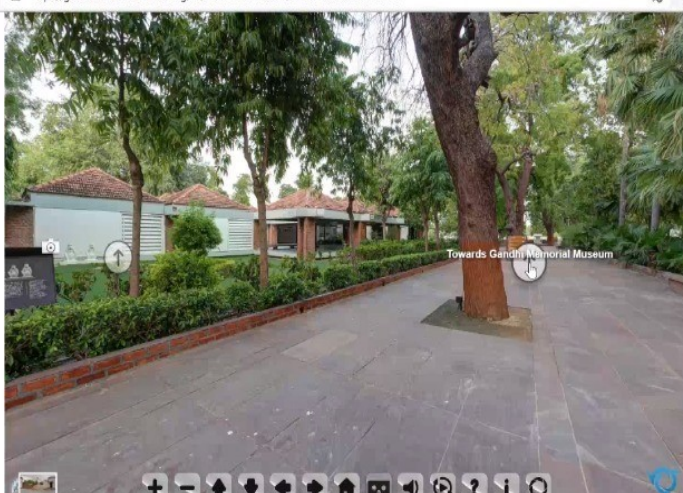
## VIRTUAL TOUR OF DELHI DARSHAN (CLASS VI)

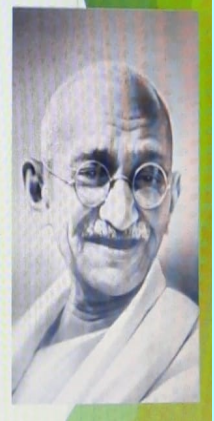


## VIRTUAL TOUR OF SABARMATI ASHRAM (CLASS VII & VIII)

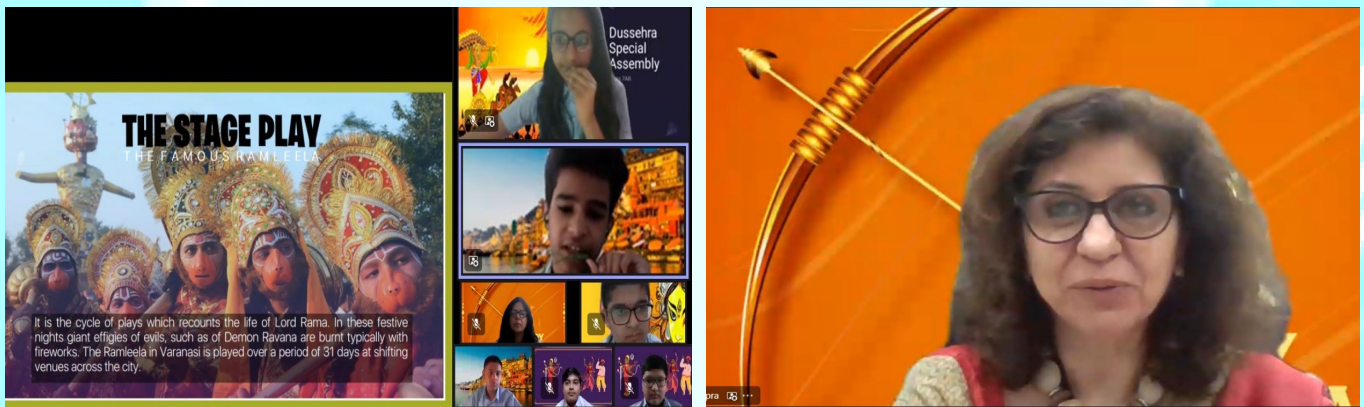
Non-Violence:

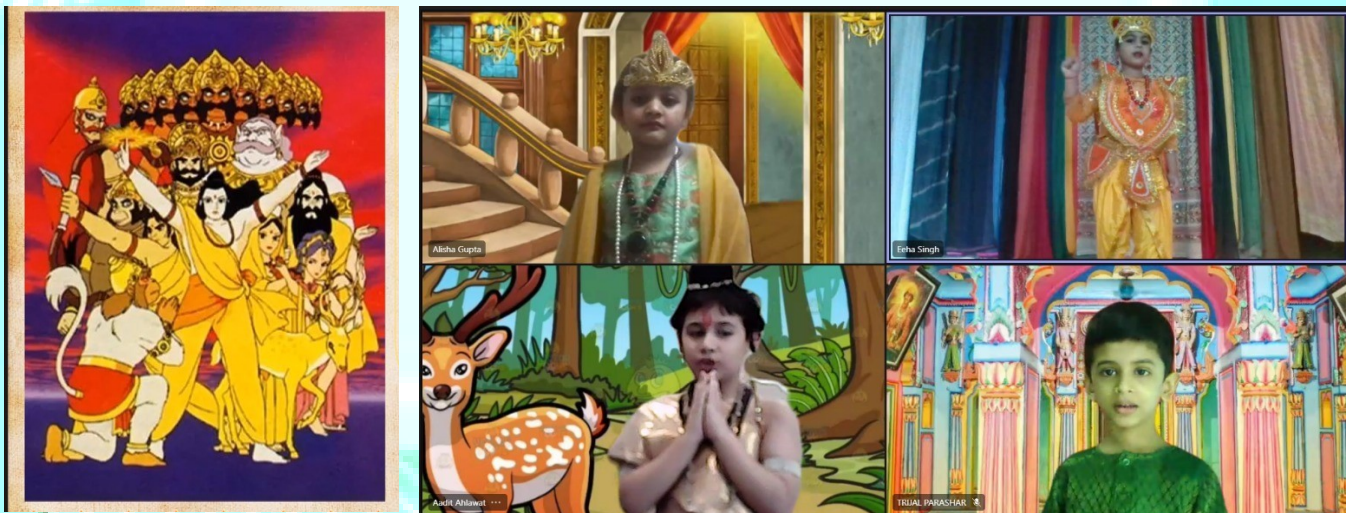

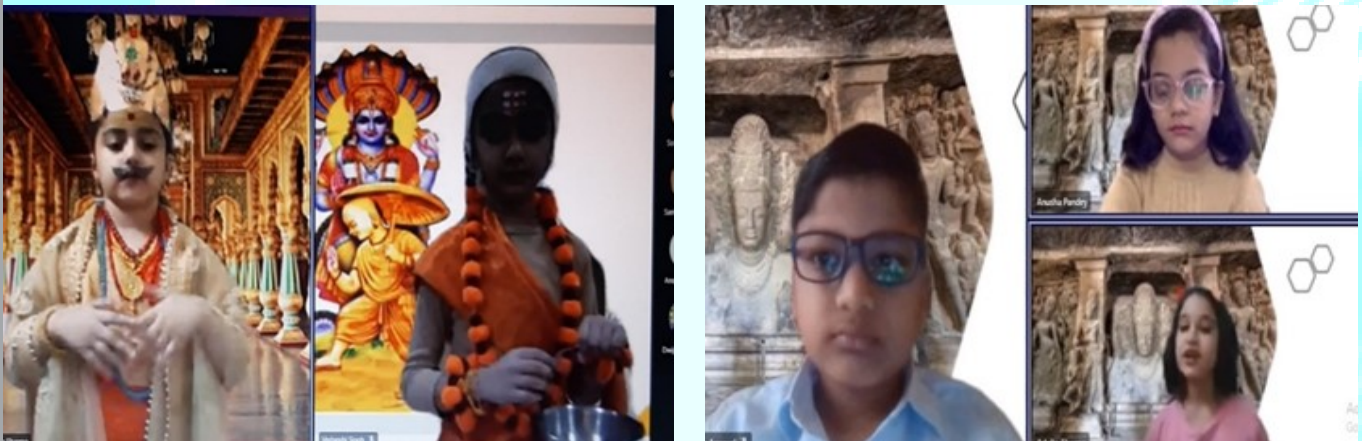

## VIRTUAL ONLINE CLASS PRESENTATION JOURNEY OF DROP (GRADE VI)

She has always emphasized the conservation of our natural resources. With a motive to realize this dream, students of Class VI of Amity International School, Sector 46 put up a presentation entitled, 'बूँद - Journey of a Drop.'

Students adopted a **multi-disciplinary approach to research** water, and the impending crisis facing the earth due to the increasing scarcity of this vital resource.
