Honing Appropriate Skills to Build Competencies for future readiness

Dear Readers,

“The best way to predict the future is to create it.”

-Abraham Lincoln

Competence is more than just knowledge or skills. It involves the ability to meet complex demands, by drawing on and mobilizing psychosocial resources (including skills and attitudes) in a particular context. Therefore outcome-based education is crucial right from students to teachers, parents, school management and the community too. We are therefore imparting life skills, using technology to integrate learnings of head, heart and hand.

Skills and competencies can be grouped into three different categories as follows:

- ICT functional skills - mastering the use of different ICT applications, like using email software and internet, word processing, spreadsheets, presentation and database.
- ICT skills for learning- cognitive abilities or higher-order thinking skills and functional skills for the use and management of ICT applications along with creativity and analytical skills to apply the right ICT skill to an activity.
- 21st century skills - necessary in the knowledge society but where the use of ICT is not necessary; eg. information, communication and ethics and social impact.

21st Century Schools like Amity 46 are creating innovative learning environments; and provide ubiquitous access to technology in classrooms, providing a rich learning environment, leading students to engage in meaningful learning processes. Competencies for future readiness can be built in the following ways:

- Meaningful contexts- The students should experience the relevance of the concept, enhancing their curiosity and moving away from rote learning
- Multidisciplinary approach- Learning is not confined to a subject but is holistic in nature.
- Constructive learning- The learners should be engaged by interaction with their environment, focusing on the construction of models, products, guidelines and reports
- Cooperative or interactive learning (with peers, teachers.) Open dialogues between learners and educators about expectation, needs, goals, choices etc.
- Discovery learning- Knowledge should be acquired through inquiry and research.
- Reflective learning- Reflecting on their own needs, motivation, approach, progress, results etc. they learn ways to cope

The New Education Policy'2020, recognizes the need for skills such as analysis, critical thinking and conceptual clarity and the focus of assessments is shifting to accommodate these. This will surely prepare our students for path of lifelong learning with excellence. It is expected that students make the most of all the opportunities provided and capture its essence, to implement in their schedules, as much as possible.

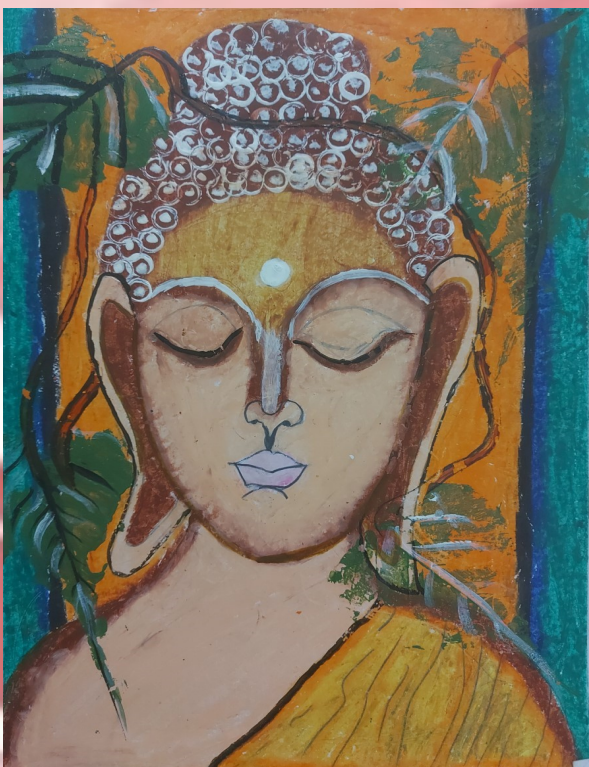

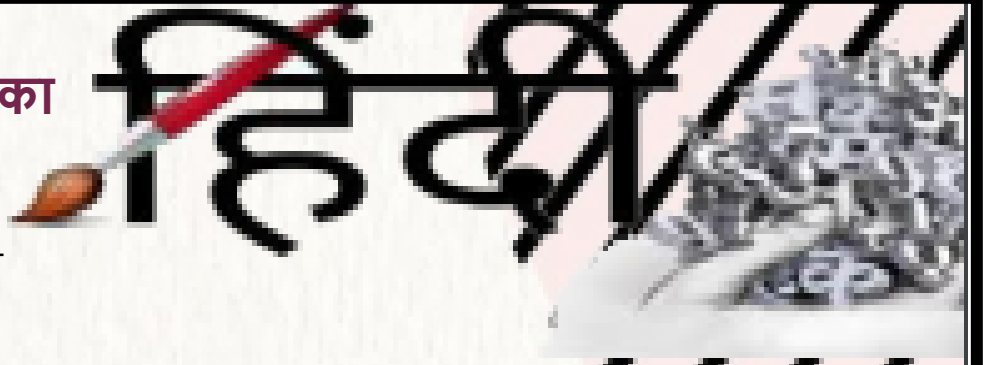

रिपोर्ट-शब्द प्रवाह 2022

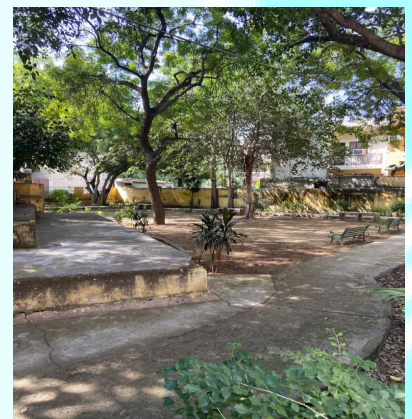
श्रीमती लीलावती अंतर ऐमिटी हिंदी शब्द-प्रवाह प्रतियोगिता' की रोमांचक यात्रा का विवरण स्वप्न द्रष्टा, संस्कृति और संस्कारों की संवाहिका परम आदरणीया डॉ.अमिता चौहान जी को अपनी हिंदी और संस्कृत भाषा से असीम प्रेम और संस्कार विरासत में प्राप्त हुए हैं, जिन्हें वे ऐमिटी के हर बालक तक संप्रेषित करना चाहती हैं। महोदया, आप तरंग हैं, आप उमंग हैं, आप वितान हैं और आप उडान हैं, आपकी उत्कट अभिलाषा है कि विश्वस्तरीय मंच पर ऐमिटी के बालक हिंदी के कुशल वक्ता, लेखक, विषय-मर्मज्ञ और हिंदी प्रेमी के रूप में प्रतिष्ठित हों। इस लक्ष्य के क्रियान्वयन में ऐमिटी की शैक्षिक निदेशिका और सलाहकार आदरणीया मोहिना दार मैम के समृद्ध दिग्दर्शन ने शब्द प्रवाह प्रतियोगिता को अपने चरमोत्कर्ष पर पहुँचाया है। विगत वर्ष शब्द प्रवाह प्रतियोगिता रूपी बीज का आरोपण हुआ था इस वर्ष नन्हा पादप 26 सितंबर से 29 सितंबर 2022 के मध्य पल्लवित हुआ। इस वर्ष संपूर्ण शब्दकोश को प्रतियोगिता का आधार बनाया गया जिसमें छात्रों की भाषा को सुदृढ़ बनाने हेतु शब्दों की व्याकरणिक कोटि, अर्थ, पर्याय, विलोम और वाक्य प्रयोग को शामिल किया गया। कक्षाओं के स्तर के अनुरूप प्रतियोगिता में 8 अंक के 5 चक्र तथा 10 अंक का एक तीव्र चक्र सम्मिलित था। इसप्रकार शब्द प्रवाह प्रतियोगिता के लिए 50 अंक निर्धारित थे। प्रतियोगिता में पहेलियाँ, दोहे, श्रुतिसम भिन्नार्थक शब्द, अनेक शब्दों के लिए एक शब्द, उपसर्ग, प्रत्यय समास, पदबंध, रचना के आधार पर वाक्य भेद मुहावरे आदि समाहित थे। इस महायज्ञ में ऐमिटी के 15 विद्यालयों के कक्षा एक से कक्षा 10 तक के सभी बच्चों ने उत्साहपूर्वक भाग लिया। आयोजक विद्यालयों ने अति भव्य और रचनात्मकता से परिपूर्ण कुशल आयोजन किए। प्रतिभागी तो हवा की गति से उत्तर दे रहे थे। बहुत सुंदर दृश्य थे। पूरा ऐमिटी परिवार हिंदी की सतरंगी आभा से दैदीप्यमान हो उठा। इन चार दिनों में सभी विद्यार्थियों द्वारा प्रयुक्त सुंदर और साहित्यिक शब्दावली की इंद्रधनुषी छटाएँ सबके मन को पुलकित कर रही थीं। कहीं कनिष्ठ छात्रों द्वारा राजा के स्थान भूपति शब्द का प्रयोग और कहीं वरिष्ठ छात्रों द्वारा स्वरचित कविता पाठ इस प्रतियोगिता के उन्नत स्तर का परिचय दे रहे थे। अतः हमें ऐसा अनुभव हो रहा है कि हमारी माननीया अध्यक्षा जी का विचार पूर्ण अधिगम प्राप्ति की ओर अग्रसर है। ऐमिटी गुरुग्राम सैक्टर-४६ की प्रधानाचार्या की आवाज़ पूर्णतः सत्य लगी कि -

MOHYAL COLONY HERITAGE : 200 YEAR OLD MEMORIAL OF FRENCH MAJOR JEAN ETIENNE

As part of Heritage Education and in collaboration with Interact club of AISG 46, Gurugram, students visited the Heritage site -200 year old memorial, along the Mohyal Colony of Gurgaon Sector 40 on 11 October, '22. This monument bears a rich history since the days of Begam Samru who ruled over Jharsa -Badashapur pargana in 1863. The Monument is dedicated to the memory of Major Jean Etienne who served Begam Samru. The head of RWA Mrs Vaid took the students on a walk around the monument highlighting the need and support to restore the lost glory of the place. CUET SESSION

A comprehensive webinar on CUET and Revision of question bank was taken by Mr B.N Bajpai , Advisor , Research and Development, and Ms Arti Chopra, Principal AISG 46, on October 8, 2022 from 10 AM TO 12 PM on MS TEAMS PLATFORM for teachers and educators and on October 1, 2022 for parents respectively. Mr Bajpai apprised the teachers across all Amity branches about recent changes and developments brought about by the NEP and the NTA in the form of the CUET and the need to adapt to the big changes that are happening in the education sector in India. Principal Ms Arti Chopra addressed the parents and explained in detail the structure of CUET comprising Section I which includes languages, Section II, Domain specific and Section III, General Ability along with the various Universities that come under CUET, and laid out a detailed plan for the revamping of question bank along with CUET questions for Class XII. Mr Sumit Chauhan, Senior coordinator for Amity International Schools who was in both sessions with Ms. Anupama Jain; proposed a CRASH COURSE and an ALL INDIA MOCK TEST SERIES to be introduced for students and that CUET preparation for Section I & II will be included in the everyday classes, through MCQ handouts, included in unit tests and weekly assignments whereas Section III will be taken online by AICE during school hours.
