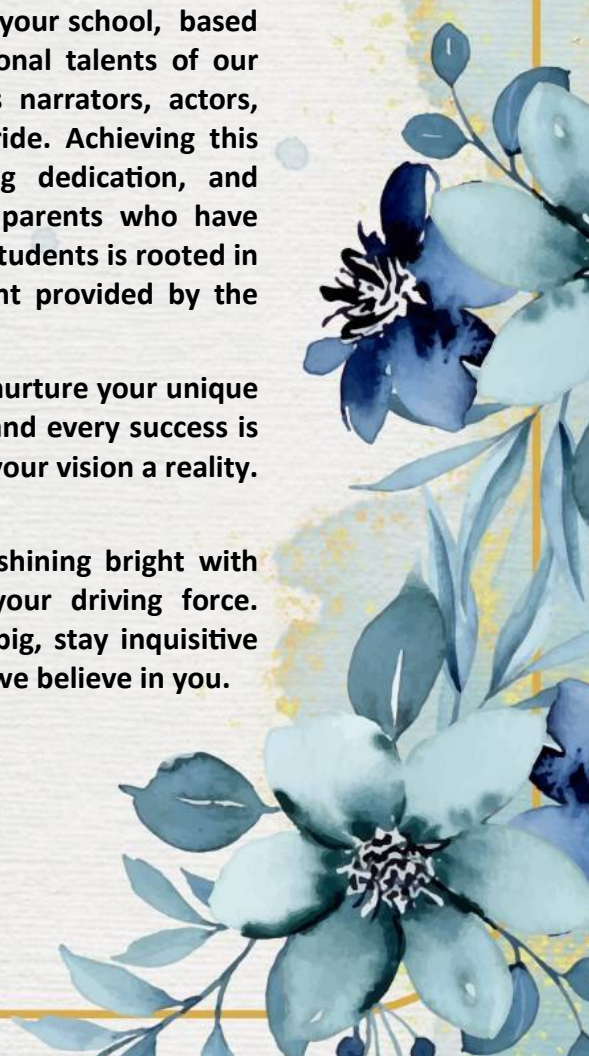

## Building Character to Inspire Change



**Dear Readers,**

## Our Scholars Shine at the Science Colloquium - 2024

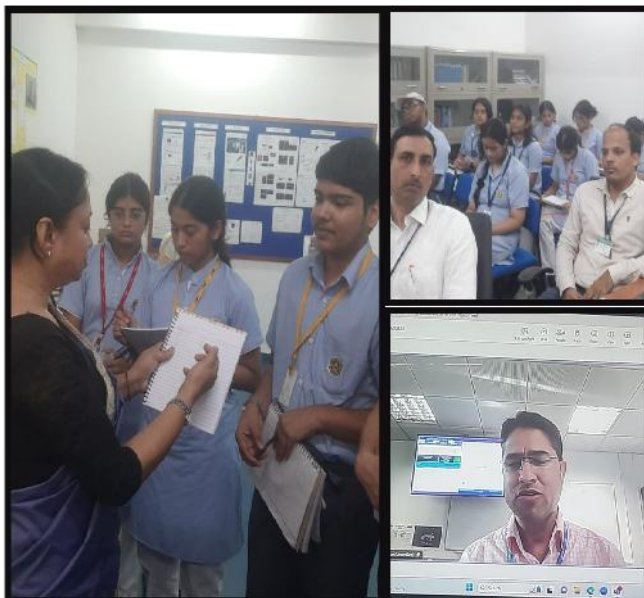
