Founder's Day Celebration



The theme of the conference was Coexistence: What can we do to create a society where everyone can live together peacefully and harmoniously? The Amitians proudly represented India as cultural ambassadors and gained valuable insights throughout the course of the programme. In the Inaugural Ceremony, Mr. Keiji Terada, Executive Director, delivered an inspiring address, emphasizing coexistence, respect for diversity, and collective responsibility. Mr. Yashuhiro Higashitani, Principal, introduced the mascot RITS and reiterated the need to build inclusive and sustainable societies. Introductory videos of all participating schools were screened, and Amity's video was appreciated for its creativity and clarity. DISHA 2025 emerged as a notably successful and influential initiative, reinforcing the school's dedication to comprehensive education and readiness for the future.


Annual ACC Training Camp, Manesar

Overnight Observation- (Space Astronomy Club Module-1)

It was a great learning with fun where students enjoyed the cultural programme and folk songs / dances of Rajasthan, watched the night sky and did various hands-on activities like Astro photography, night gazing, observed various celestial bodies, learnt how to find latitude, watched Saturn and its rings, shooting stars and constellations and so on. During the overnight module 1, students observed the deep sky objects in the sky like Saturn, Jupiter, Summer triangle, Andromeda galaxy, Alberio double star, Pleidies star cluster, Perseus double star cluster, Orion nebula, Betelgeuse red star and Sirius star. They also learnt about alignment of telescopes. Overall it was an insightful trip for our young scientists.




Boba – “The Trendsetter”


Hot Chocolate – “The Cozy Bestie”




