Curriculum at Amity integrates techniques for communication through listening, speaking, reading & writing practices, critical thinking by incorporating higher order thinking questioning techniques, collaboration for innovative problem solving, digital skills by teaching tools of technology like video making, adaptability by instilling a passion to change surrounding for overall well-being and becoming agents of change etc .

Abhay Bailey Shines Bright in INSPIRE–MANAK 2024–25 with Innovative AI Project



Abhay Bailey OF class XI A has been awarded the prestigious INSPIRE–MANAK Grant for the year 2024–25. This flagship scheme, under the Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research (INSPIRE) programme of the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India, is implemented in collaboration with the National Innovation Foundation (NIF) to ignite scientific temperament among students of Classes 6 to 10 across India.

Abhay's innovative project, Rakshak-AI—an Artificial Intelligence-based threat detection system—was selected for its strong technical feasibility and social relevance. He received a state-level grant of ₹10,000 under the Haryana State Innovation Scheme. His project is now eligible for further participation at prestigious forums such as the District, State, and National Level Exhibitions and Project Competitions (DLEPC, SLEPC, NLEPC).

Outstanding Achievements in Unified International Olympiads

Zuhaan Akbar Sofi, a student of Grade III demonstrated exceptional brilliance and dedication, securing top ranks in two prestigious national-level competitions. He secured All India Rank 1 in NSTSE (National Science Talent Search Examination) and was awarded a medal, certificate and a laptop. She emphasized the importance of integrating multiple sciences to spark curiosity and foster innovation among students.

The atmosphere during the session was vibrant and intellectually stimulating. Participants expressed their appreciation for the engaging format and the relevance of the discussions to current classroom practices. Workshop For Parents on National Curriculum Framework

On 19th of July, Principal Dr. Arti Chopra led an insightful workshop for parents, on the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), focusing on key aspects to enhance teaching-learning practices. The workshop covered crucial topics that aimed to transform the educational experience for students. Effective teaching strategies for the middle stage were discussed, highlighting the importance of engaging students during this critical phase. Additionally, strategies for detoxification from gadgets were explored, emphasizing the need to promote healthy technology use and minimize distractions.

The workshop also delved into pedagogy for the secondary stage, focusing on approaches to engage and challenge students in higher grades. Furthermore, the purpose and key principles of assessment were examined, underscoring the role of assessment in learning and its essential principles. The shift towards competency-based education was also emphasized, moving away from rote learning and towards developing skills and competencies. The workshop provided valuable insights and practical takeaways for educators, aligning with the NCF's vision for student-centered and holistic learning.

Our Students Participated in first International Space Settlement Design Competition

Venturing Into Venus: VO1

Nine Students from our school represented India at the International Space Settlement Design Competition held at Kennedy Space Centre, Florida, USA. Our team comprised of Suhani Gupta (11A), Vanya Saluja (11A), Abhay Bailey (11A), Jai Dugal (11B), Soham Mukherjee (11B), Harshprit Kaur (12F), Ishani Verma (11D), Jashraaj Sahoo (12D) and Prabhjot Singh (10H).

The students along with their mentors Ms. Sangeeta Malhotra and Ms. Sunmeet Kaur reached Florida on the 24th of July. The event officially started on the 26th of July in the Kennedy Space Centre, with an opening ceremony featuring insightful talks on pitching by Mr John Bates, organisational tools and resources and other addresses.

Our school was a part of the company, "Flectel Constructors". Teams set out to understand the proposal, design the rough draft and started formulating the presentation.

This 4-day competition was an industry simulation of how different companies design a futuristic settlement on another planet or around it. It was a long journey from the qualifying round to later Indian Nationals, Asian Regionals and finally, the International Round. This was the first time the school had qualified for the International Round through an International Resubmission proposal, by designing a settlement in Mars Orbit.

Our team worked with students from the United Kingdom, China (Tsinghua International School and other schools), Mexico (Politecnico University), Kolkata (La Martiniere for Boys), Romania (Avram Iancu Theoretical Highschool) and Italy in various different departments such as Structures, Critical Infrastructure, Human Factors, Mission Systems and Business Planning, covering all the different aspects required to create a cohesive settlement.

The students expressed their gratitude to esteemed Chairperson Dr. (Ms.) Amita Chauhan for providing them with such transformative learning experiences to pursue their goals purposefully.



16th Annual Intra-school Model United Nations Conference Empowering Young Leaders

With the blessings of our esteemed Chairperson, Dr. (Mrs.) Amita Chauhan and under the guidance of Principal Dr. Arti Chopra, 16th Annual Intraschool Model United Nations Conference was conducted from 23rd July to 25th July. Students from Classes VI to XII took part in this prestigious event, which has grown into one of the most awaited academic platforms within the school.

Over 500 students participated in various capacities—as delegates, executive board members, press reporters, photographers, and members of the organizing team.
