Her project, "Vacuum Polarization Effects from Dark Fermion Loops in Z' Mediator Models and Their Impact on Angular Observables in Rare B-Meson Decays," proposed a novel hypothetical model to explain certain B-Meson anomalies and earned this award among 82 projects in the category.

Shivaji Maharaj, whom I hold dear.

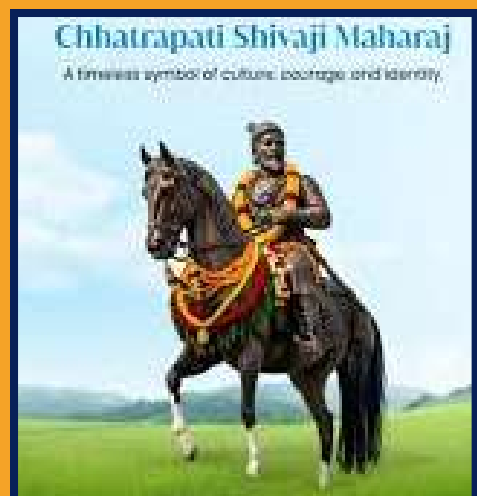
Born in Shivneri, 1630, they say, He learnt from his

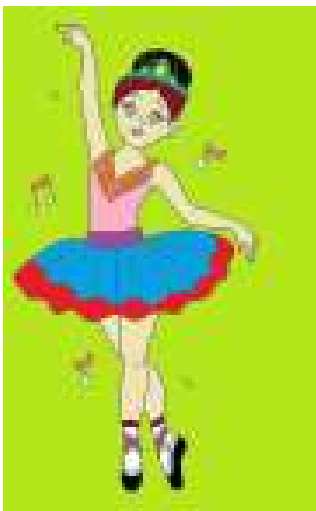

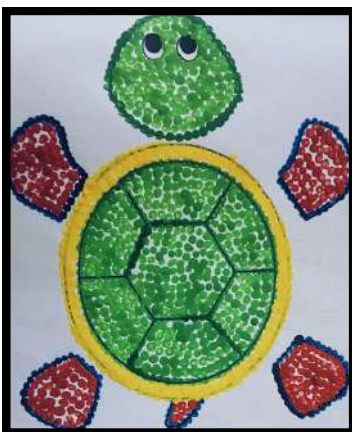

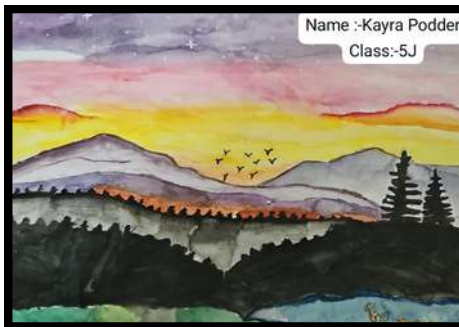
