With the hope that you will make good use of the opportunities that come your way and will continue to bag laurels and do the school proud with your achievements, I wish you all the very best for the session ahead!



VIRUS- LET'S LEARN TO COMBAT



The smallest living things are virus. They can produce more of their kind if they invade another living thing.

Viruses cannot reproduce on their own. They get into another living cell, the host

cell, and take over its life process to make more copies of themselves. In the process they destroy the host cell. A typical virus has an outer shell made of proteins. Inside is a length of genetic material, usually DNA. Example: Corona virus

Many can exist in their non -living form for years and be frozen solid, boiled or made into crystals-yet still come alive when host cells are available.

Viruses cause diseases in plants, animals and people. These include cold, flu, measles and AIDS. *Genetic mutation*


Viruses undergo genetic change by several mechanisms. These include a process called antigenic drift where individual bases in the DNA or RNA mutate to other bases. Most of these point mutations are "silent"—they do not change the protein that the gene encodes—but others can confer evolutionary advantages such as resistance to antiviral drugs. Antigenic shift occurs when there is a major change in the genome of the virus. This can be a result of recombination or reassortment. When this happens with influenza viruses, pandemics might result.

Example: In April-May months- We can see that how genetic mutation takes place in the coronavirus. *Prevention and treatment*

Viruses use vital metabolic pathways within host cells to replicate, they are difficult to eliminate without using drugs that cause toxic effects to host cells in general. The most effective medical approaches to viral diseases are vaccinations to provide immunity to infection, and antiviral drugs that selectively interfere with viral replication.

Malpua - Malpua, a sweet from Bihar made on the festival of Holi

Ingredients:

¹/₄ cup sugar

- ¹/₂ tsp fennel / saunf (powdered)
- ¹/₄ tsp cardamom powder / elachi powder

¹/₂ cup milk / rabri

water as required (to prepare batter)

oil for deep frying

rabri for serving

dry fruits for garnishing

For sugar syrup:

1cup sugar

¹/₂ cup water

1/4 tsp cardamom powder



Firstly, in a large mixing bowl take maida, rava and sugar. Add fennel powder and cardamom powder. Further add milk or rabri. Mix well making sure there are no lumps in the batter. Add water as required and mix well. Make sure the batter is of smooth pouring consistency. Cover and rest the batter for 30 minutes. Pour the batter into hot oil / ghee and press gently with the help of perforated spoon. Now fry both sides till they turn golden brown. Soak the malpuas into hot sugar syrup. Rest for 10 minutes making sure both the sides of malpua are soaked well. Finally, serve malpuas hot with rabri and garnished with few nuts. Saksham- V-C

INGREDIENTS: 3 cup puffed rice /

3 cup puffed rice / murmura / churmuri

- ¹/₂ tsp kashmiri red chilli powder
- 1/4 tsp cumin powder / jeera powder
- ¹/₄ tsp garam masala
- ¹/₂ tsp chaat masala ¹/₄ tsp aamchur / dry mango powder
- ¹/₄ tsp salt 2 tbsp onion (finely chopped)
- 2 tosp onion (finely chopped) 2 tosp cucumber (finely chopped) 10 cubes potato (boiled & peeled)
- 3 tbsp peanuts (fried)
- 2 tbsp tomato (finely chopped) 1 green chilli (finely chopped)
- ¹/₂ inch ginger (chopped)
- 1 tbsp tamarind pulp
- 2 tbsp mustard oil
- 3 tbsp sev

1 tsp coriander (finely chopped)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Firstly, in a large bowl take 3 cup puffed rice. Dry roast puffed rice if they are not crispy.

 Add ½ tsp chilli powder, ¼ tsp cumin powder, ¼ tsp garam masala, ½ tsp chaat masala, ¼ tsp amchur and ¼ tsp salt.
Additionally add 2 tbsp onion, 2 tbsp cucumber, 10 cubes potato, 3 tbsp peanuts, 2 tbsp tomato, 1 green chilli and ½ inch ginger.

4. Further add 1 tbsp tamarind pulp, 2tbsp mustard oil and 3 tbsp sev.

Mix well without making puffed rice soggy. 5. Finally, serve jhal muri topped with coriander leaves.




ONSET OF OPPORTUNITIESTIES

Unity, and not Uniformity, brings our Nation it's unique fame A model of UNITY IN DIVERSITY, to the World we proclaim.




Orientation Program for Classes VI-VIII




BOOK REVIEW

The story is set in Malgudi, an imaginary town located somewhere on the banks of Sarayu. (a river in South India) Swami and Friends are the first of a trilogy set in a fictional town of Malgudi. The plot revolves around Swami, a demure yet outspoken boy, and his two friends Rajam- The boy who everyone looks up to in class and Mani- the big bruiser who everyone fears. They get involved in various adventures on the norm meand the town to find.

in various adventures as they roam around the town trying to find things to do. Swami's days are full of action. Aladdin (2019)


