MOVIE REVIEW

This Hindi movie tells the story of a former athlete, now a working mother, who sets out to recapture her former glory. Jaya, the heroine of "Panga," a working mom with a sickly little boy and a smiling husband, cooks, does laundry, shoos her child onto the school bus. She hovers and worries. And is unhappy.

Once upon a time, though, Jaya (Kangana Ranaut) was somebody: the captain of India's women's kabaddi team. But she quit playing when her husband's job moved the family to Bhopal from Delhi.

Can she make a comeback?

That's the question in this lightly feminist film, which shifts from being a domestic dramedy to an underdog sports tale, a favorite genre of Indian movies. The link is family: Will Jaya's husband, Prashant (Jassie Gill), and little boy, Adi (Yagya Bhasin), support her return to kabaddi? Even if she has to move away from them to practice with the team?

Directed by Ashwiny Iyer Tiwari, "Panga" has an understated realism — about the tempos of family life and the Indian middle class. The drama, too, is understated: bumps in a road paved with good will rather than a clash of values and goals. – Jiya Ranjan, VIII-D
