- Till 1974 Sikkim was recognized as an independent nation. On May16,1975 Sikkim officially became the 22nd state of India.
- Sikkim is bordered by the **Tibet Autonomous Region** of China to the north and northeast, by Bhutan to the southeast, by the Indian state of West Bengal to the south, and by Nepal to the west. Sikkim has 619,000 inhabitants as per 2012 census.
- The predominant religions in the state are Hinduism and Vajrayana Buddhism.
- Sikkim has over 552 different species of birds and 690 species of butterflies
- The state has 28 mountain peaks ,and has more than 80 glaciers
- It has 227 high Altitude Lake, five major hot springs and more than 100 rivers and streams.
- In 2014, the state's GDP was calculated to be 1.57 billion USD which was the third smallest among India's 28 states.


WESTERN MUSIC SOLO SINGING/INSTRUMENTAL COMPETITION


