

With the support and guidance of our honorable Chairperson Ma'am and with constant hard-work of children, parents and teachers, we have been able to achieve this remarkable success.

It is indeed a proud moment for all of us that our students came out with flying colours at the Class XII examination conducted by the CBSE with an impressive school average of 91.5%. Our student Rishabh Sharma, is the topper for Science Stream from all Amity Schools, with an aggregate of 98.6%. Tanmay Khandelwal of Commerce Stream was the Overall School Topper with 98.8% while Arshiya Dhatwalia with 97.8% was the Topper from Humanities Stream. AMITY'S GOT TALENT





Colours are beautiful, be black or white,


Can the stars shine sans the night?

AUTHOR: JOHN GRISHAM


GENRE: Legal Thriller

Michael Brock, a young and ambitious lawyer at a reputed law firm in DC, is making the big money, rushing tirelessly up the ladder of success. He stands just one step away from partnership, when a life-changing incident happens. Within a moment, it all comes undone.

The story follows how an event changes the course of Brock's entire life. With the changing dynamics of the many relationships he is involved in, old ties loosen and new bonds form. The most prominent character alongside Brock is his newly found companion and lawyer, Mordecai Green. Together, they ruffle some feathers to bring about the change they wish to see. Faced with complex dilemmas, Michael makes multiple decisions, always leaving the reader to question what they would've done and what would've been the right thing to do.

The plot surges forward, intricately crafted and smoothly driven, while addressing an important issue at hand, with genuine compassion and considerable earnestness. A compelling read, The Street Lawyer throws light on an important social topic that is often neglected because of its apparent 'futility'– homelessness, forcing the reader to often sympathize with the powerless.

Overall, The Street Lawyer is a must-read for any fan of thrillers or realistic fiction, or if you want to read a book that would definitely leave an everlasting impact on your mind and in the way you perceive the world.


