This book is a perfect read for children of elementary school. It illustrates many lively portrayals of life in Indian cities.

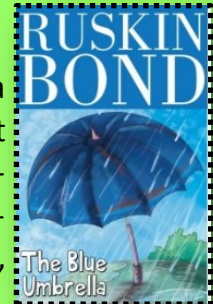
Very vividly it pens the wait of a child for the rain after dry hot weather. It captures the magical effect and energy that downpour brings to the entire community.

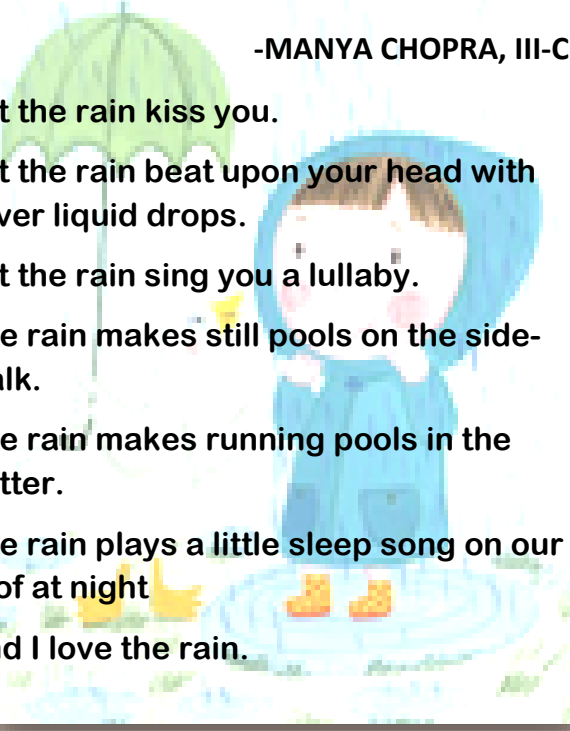

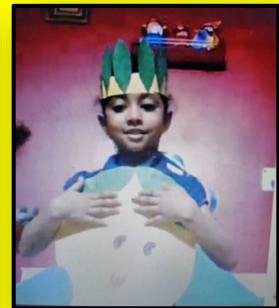

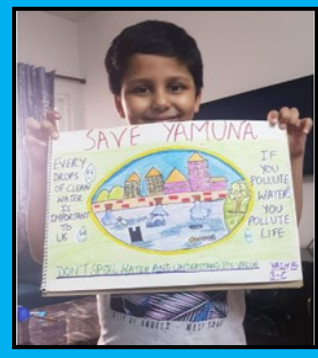
Mango Day Celebrations

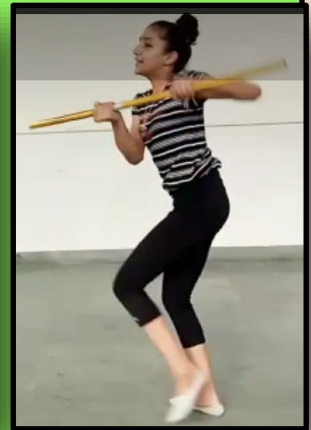
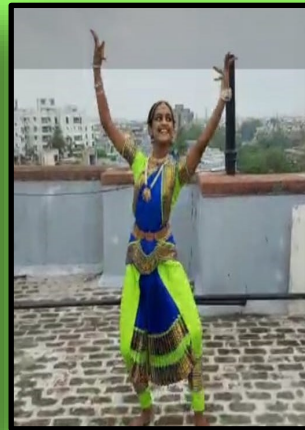
AMITY'S GOT TALENT

Hit our nostrils,

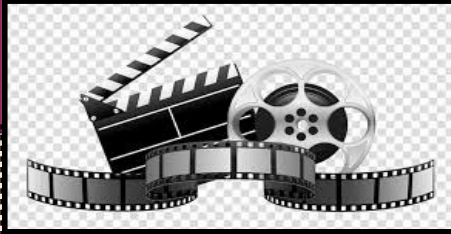

MOVIE REVIEW

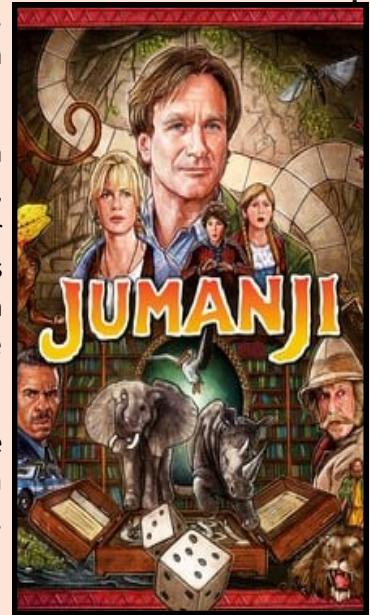
“Adventurers beware: do not begin, unless you intend to finish.”

A movie that hits best when watched twice, as a kid, and as a kid inside. Jumanji is a movie that hides beneath, it's family friendly and fun to watch appeal, powerful emotions of nostalgia and introspection.

A young boy, Alan Parrish, in a rich orthodox 60s family and his neighbor Sarah find a supernatural board game “Jumanji”. And Alan is drawn into it (well, quite literally). Fast-forward to present, Judy (Kirsten Dunst) and her brother find the game again. When they play however, Alan (Robin Williams) is released and they must finish the game, find Sarah (Bonnie Hunt) for her turn to roll the dice. After finding her, they must hurry and complete the game before the impending doom befalls.

The score by James Horner successfully encompasses the ambience of the movie. A second watch reveals a layered dynamic between the struggles of a father-son relationship and the complexities that come with a new generation. Perfect family entertainment!

AUTHOR: JOHN GRISHAM

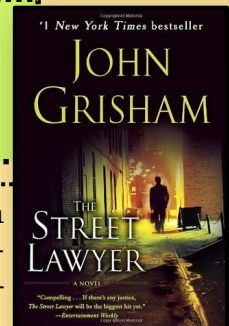
GENRE: Legal Thriller

Michael Brock, a young and ambitious lawyer at a reputed law firm in DC, is making the big money, rushing tirelessly up the ladder of success. He stands just one step away from partnership, when a life-changing incident happens. Within a moment, it all comes undone.

The story follows how an event changes the course of Brock's entire life. With the changing dynamics of the many relationships he is involved in, old ties loosen and new bonds form. The most prominent character alongside Brock is his newly found companion and lawyer, Mordecai Green. Together, they ruffle some feathers to bring about the change they wish to see. Faced with complex dilemmas, Michael makes multiple decisions, always leaving the reader to question what they would've done and what would've been the right thing to do.

The plot surges forward, intricately crafted and smoothly driven, while addressing an important issue at hand, with genuine compassion and considerable earnestness. A compelling read, The Street Lawyer throws light on an important social topic that is often neglected because of its apparent 'futility'- homelessness, forcing the reader to often sympathize with the powerless.

Overall, The Street Lawyer is a must-read for any fan of thrillers or realistic fiction, or if you want to read a book that would definitely leave an everlasting impact on your mind and in the way you perceive the world.

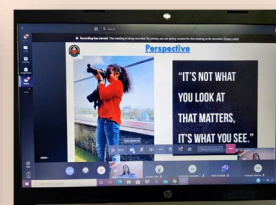
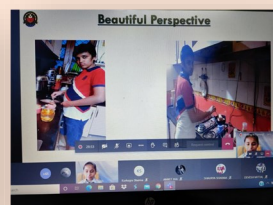
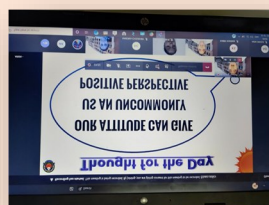
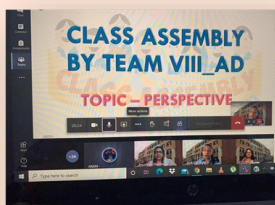
Following this the former members of Crescendo, Mana Sharma, Moulshree Kumar and Armaan Afzal gave a pep talk to the newly formed society.

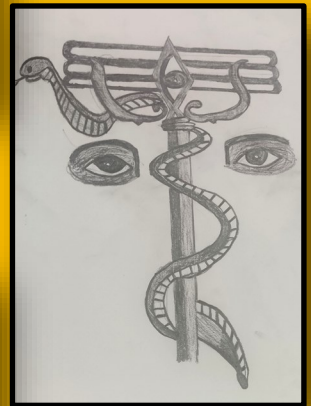

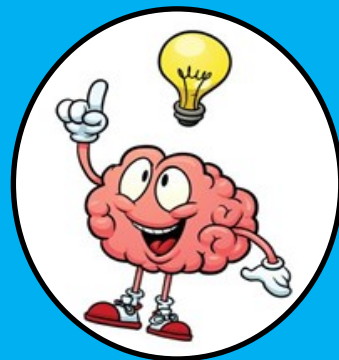
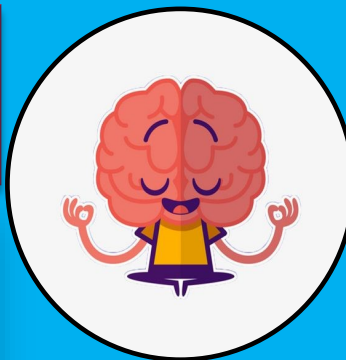
