But today no one is waiting for me at the door

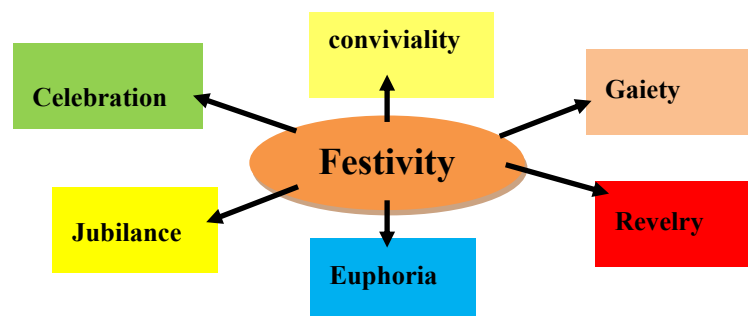
Everything has turned back what it was

Leaving the tail behind when they escape.

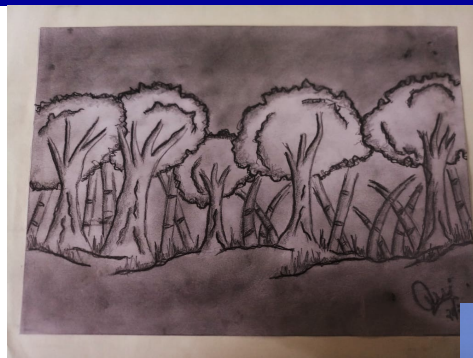
We are the wish makers,
