Dear Students,

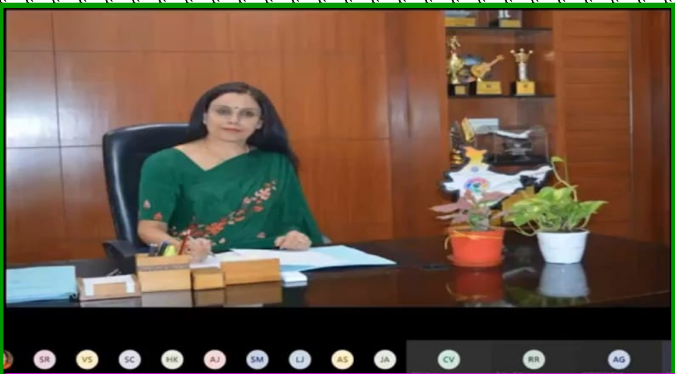
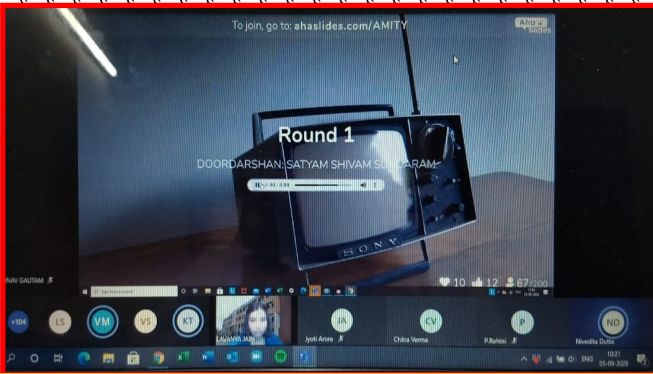

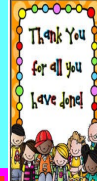
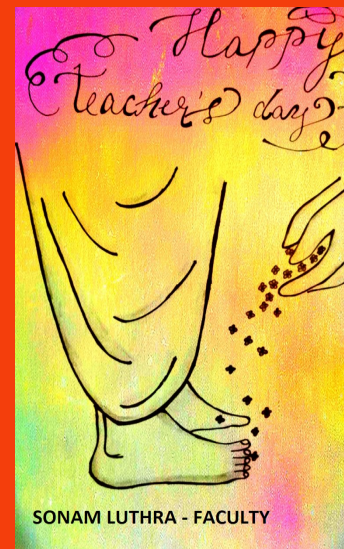
Takeaway From This Lockdown

I admire them all.*

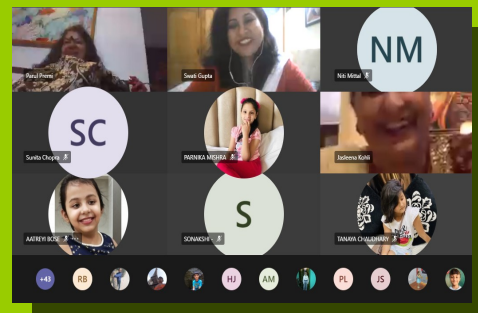
## Teacher's Day activity

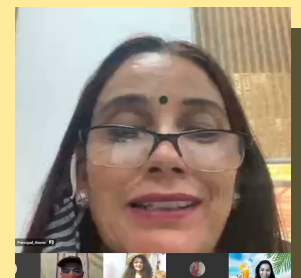

## BEACH PARTY

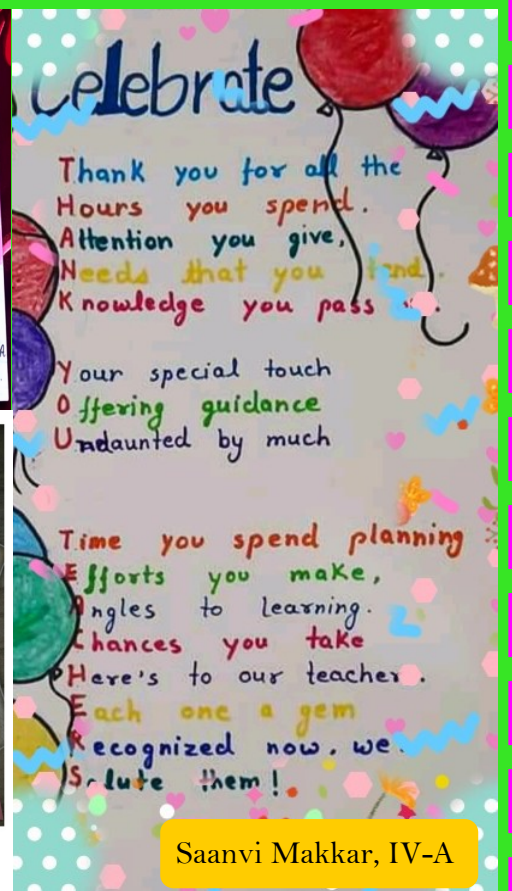
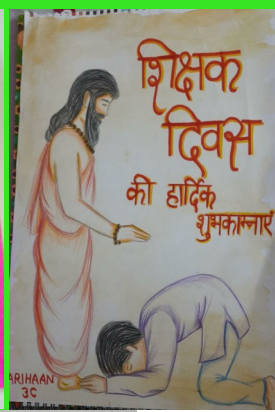

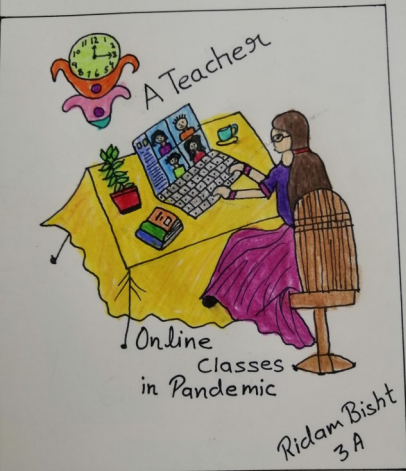
