The rain and its aftermath was a warning for us to stop for a moment and consider the consequences of rapid development and the toll it has taken on nature and how it can come back to haunt us. There is a message here which is waiting to be understood.

## MOVIE REVIEW: "THE SOCIAL NETWORK"

David Fincher's "The Social Network" is a compelling and thought-provoking movie that explores the history and debates around the founding of Facebook and the upcoming legal battles.. This 2010 movie explores themes of ambition, friendship, betrayal, and the challenges of the digital era while providing a fictionalized account of the birth of the social media giant.

## NATIONAL TECHNOLOGY WEEK

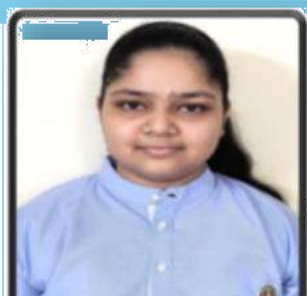

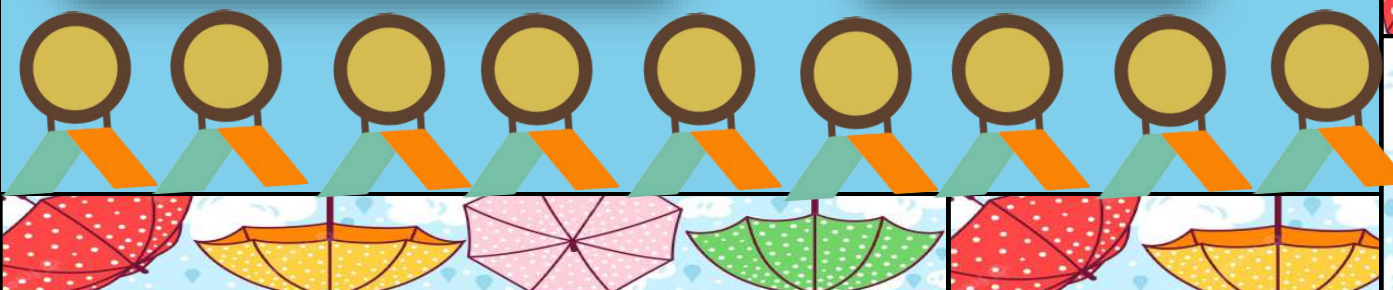
