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


When she can set out unquestioned alone Whatever time of day or night And yet feel safe and sound Then shall she be truly free True Freedom having found.

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The world is evolving at a fast pace making the need for the internet quintessential. The last few years have seen a drastic change in the use of the internet which has evolved manifold. The accessibility and use of the internet has started a new era of knowledge sharing and the ability to connect billions of people around the globe. Perhaps, it opens a plethora of information that offers an endless pool of knowledge and entertainment.

However, besides having many advantages, there is a flip side to censorship which comes with lot of restrictions as well.

Today, access to the internet has broken all boundaries where anyone from a 3-year-old to a 30-year-old can access the internet even over the mobile phone. This has caused lot of disruption amongst the younger generation, as they are privy to sensitive and adult content which is not meant for them, and they have this access only because the internet is not censored. It will be the taxpayer's money that will be used to cover the cost of this unwarranted expense. That means all of us end up paying for our ability to let other people control the data we see without really having a way to alter the outcome.

In the end, remember that this is high time that we realize and find the perfect and appropriate side for ourselves, to decide whether we are willing to share our privacy with many of those who are ready to abuse and misuse it or we believe that the change in people's perception can only be brought through conversation, not through censoring the content creation.

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

They say rain is the perfect time to dive into thriller or mystery novel. During rainfall, the sound of raindrops hitting the roof seems to provide a soothing backdrop that allows you to fully absorb the essence of every word. A few weeks ago, on a day when rain was falling gently from the sky, I decided to immerse myself in a book authored by the renowned Laura Dave. This book was none other than "The Last Thing He Told Me". The first thing that that instantly caught my eye was the quote right before the starting of the story-

(Let's go said he not too far said she what's too far said he where you are said she)

As I went through the book, the quote established the tone of the story and served as a core support to the plot.

OVERVIEW

Before Owen Michaels disappears, he manages to smuggle a note to his new wife, Hannah: *protect her*. Hannah knows exactly who Owen needs to protect- his teenage daughter, Bailey, who lost her mother tragically as a child. And who wants absolutely nothing to do with her new stepmother.

All her desperate calls to her husband go unanswered, she gets to know that Owen's boss has been arrested for fraud. She realizes that her husband my not be as she thinks he is. Before long, Bailey stumbles upon a bag containing a substantial sum of money, and Hannah validates that Bailey holds the crucial role in unveiling Owen's genuine identity.

As the story unravels itself, Hannah and Bailey form an alliance and try to find clues that might lead them to Owen. They come across old ties and relations and form fresh bonds. They also discover the mystery and secrets about Bailey's mother and her family.

REVIEW

From my perspective, this story is an absolute necessity to read; it's one of those books that you can't put down once you start. Personally, I find myself engrossed in its pages every available moment. The narrative possesses a compelling force that draws you in.

During the whole book, we get to know about Owen's personality through the small flashbacks in the story. Nonetheless, a drawback I find is the novel's singular focus on Hannah's perspective. Unfortunately, Bailey's thoughts and emotions throughout the ordeal remain a mystery.

The plot also contradicts the notion 'Blood is thicker than water'. Throughout the story, Hannah and Bailey develop a bond and understanding as they go through several ups and downs to find Owen.

The entire narrative is enthralling, building high expectations for its conclusion. Yet, when the finale arrives, it's unexpectedly concise and abrupt. This outcome doesn't truly honour the story or the deep connection between Hannah and Bailey. I yearned for Bailey to openly convey her affection and acceptance of Hannah as her mother. I want to see Hannah to be able to call Bailey her daughter openly without any awkwardness.

I believe this book deserves a solid four-star rating from my perspective. If you're a fan of captivating thrillers, then this is unquestionably the selection for you. Waste no time, procure the book without delay, and set it aside for your next reading session on a rainy day.

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EXPERIENCE Day 1: There were 22 students including myself from all over India, accompanied by 3 representatives from Goethe Institute and local travel agents on the trip to Germany. On 5th June, 2023 MMB organised an orientation session and briefed us about the trip and provided us with I-cards, booklets, 3 different coloured t-shirts (that were to be worn on specified days) etc. The assembling time and day for departure was 09:00 am, 12th June, 2023 at gate number 7, terminal 3, IGI airport. All of us had to wear an orange coloured t-shirt given by MMB for identification. The flight was scheduled for 12:50 pm. We reached Frankfurt International Airport at 18:20 (German time). From there we went to dinner and then headed to hotel. Before bed time, which was 22:00 (German time) we had a debriefing session.

Frankfurt Day 2: On the first day of our trip to Frankfurt, we started with an early breakfast call at 7 am. Then we proceeded to the Frankfurt University of Management and Finance. There we had an introductory session which provided us with an overview of the university and its programs. Following the introductory session, we had the opportunity to meet the university's career team. Their session aimed to guide us in making informed decisions about our future career paths in Germany and at Frankfurt University. To familiarize ourselves with the university campus, a tour was arranged, giving us a glimpse of the facilities, classrooms, and other important areas. The tour helped us envision what it would be like to study at the university. Lunch was served at the university, providing us with an opportunity to socialize with fellow students and faculty members. The atmosphere was vibrant. After the university visit, we had the chance to explore the city of Frankfurt. Sightseeing allowed us to appreciate the rich history and culture of the city. We visited prominent landmarks. In addition to sightseeing, we were given some free time for shopping at local markets. To conclude the day, we had dinner at a local restaurant where MMB had an interaction planned with the social media influencer, Nandini Dung. At around 8 pm, we returned to our hotel and a debriefing session and got some journal time, during which we had to write our day summary. Upon reaching Amsterdam, we had some time allocated for shopping. This allowed us to explore the local markets and shops. We had lunch at a local restaurant. After this, we went on a canal cruise. The canal cruise provided a unique perspective of Amsterdam's picturesque waterways, iconic bridges, and historic architecture. We were able to admire the city's beauty while learning about its history and significance from the informative commentary on board. The canal cruise lasted approximately an hour. After the canal cruise, we departed from Amsterdam and traveled to Heffen, which is approxi-



During the travel we visited a few more sightseeing places like the Deutsches Ecke. We had lunch at a restaurant. We reached the airport at the designated time. The flight was scheduled for 20:20 (German time).

Day 8: We reached India after 9 hours long flight journey, at 8:30am (Indian time), terminal 3, IGI airport, Delhi.

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
