

ORIENTATION CEREMONY

WORLD HEALTH DAY







World Health Day is a global health awareness day, celebrated every year on 7th April. This day is observed to mark the founding of WHO.

As a part of World Health Day celebrations at Amity, physical activities such as yoga and meditation were conducted for Grade 3 on March 7, 2022 with the message-"No action today- No cure tomorrow".

The morning began with age-appropriate mindfulness meditation and yoga sessions for all the students of Grade 3.

The punch line for the activity was 'Living the Present and Living in the Present'. Ms. Shikha Singh, yoga instructor at Amity, Mayur Vihar talked about how these exercises help increase awareness of one's own thoughts and feelings to reduce anxiety and boost levels of concentration. Students were told strategies like controlling negative thoughts, engaging in hobbies, exercise, making lifestyle changes and seeking professional help when required.

During the session, Ms. Jasleena Kohli, Primary Coordinator actively interacted with the students about how to achieve the Sustainable Development Goal 3 i.e. regular and adequate physical activity is crucial to life-long physical and mental health. Physical activity promotes blood and oxygen flows, burns energy and helps enhance mental well-being – all essential to reducing the risk of noncommunicable diseases (NCDs.

I'll color very carefully, My writing will be neat. And I will not be happy, Till my papers are complete.




Inter – Amity Vocabathon for Class – 8

MASTER CHEF

Summertime Mango Strawberry Smoothy

Ingredients

- 2 scoops vanilla Ice-cream
- 2 tsp strawberry syrup
- Yoghurt (of your choice, preferably Strawberry Yoghurt)
- 1 glass cold Almond milk
