It is indeed a proud moment for all of us that our students came out with flying colours at the Class XII examination conducted by the CBSE with an impressive school average of 90.08%. Prajwal Tiwari of Science Stream and Navya Rastogi of Commerce Stream were the overall school toppers with an incredible hundred in four subjects and a stupendous aggregate of 99.2% while Megha Rani was the topper in Humanities Stream with an impressive hundred in three subjects and an outstanding aggregate of 98.8%. The school added another feather to its cap when 69 students secured a perfect score of 100% in various subjects at the examination.

Our students performed equally well and put up an excellent performance at the Class X Examination with a school average of 89.6%. 


INVESTITURE CEREMONY 2022-23


Our Principal, Ms Meenu Kanwar Ma'am graced the event and motivated the children to know more about their country, India and to be proud of it.






INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY
