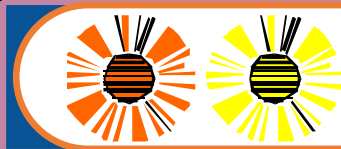

The event was concluded with an address by our respected Principal Ma’am.

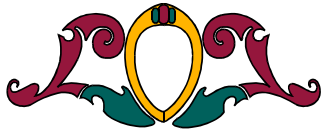


Founders' Day Celebration

The next day, we went to Keoladeo Ghana National Park where we saw Asiatic jackals, fishing cats, nilgai, blackbucks, foxes and mongeese.

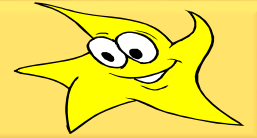
In total we were in Bharatpur for three days. Then happily, we went home.

HINDI DIWAS

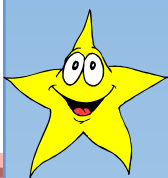

The co-ordinators appreciated the students and motivated them to continue with the same zeal and enthusiasm.

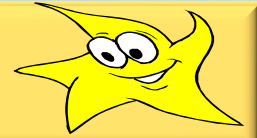


GRANDPARENTS' DAY

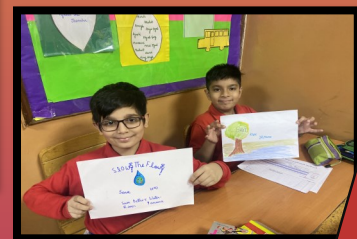
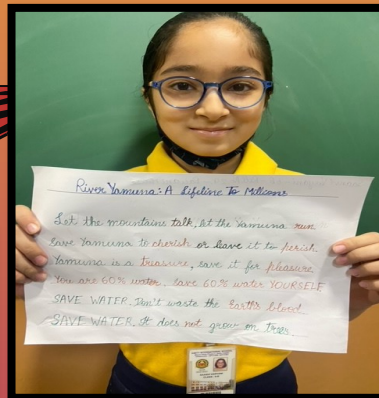

Activity - Slogan Writing Interhouse Competition on 'River Yamuna: A lifeline to millions.'

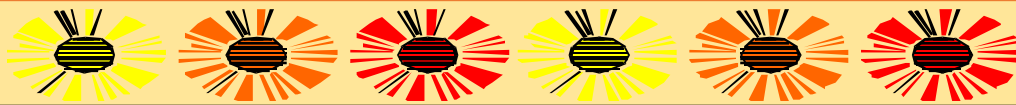

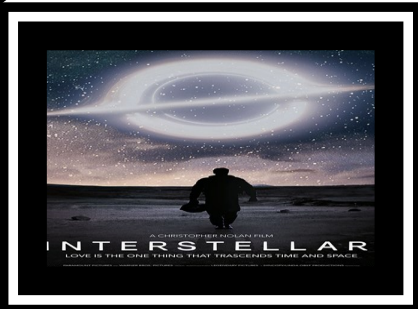


SHANTAM NEOGI

The most incredible aspect is that they exploit a wormhole close to Saturn to explore the farthest reaches of the universe in quest of a habitable environment.

The fact that a real physicist is consulting on the film makes it one of the most realistically scientific films ever made. There will, however, undoubtedly be some exceptions and creative licence used. Overall, an exciting movie to watch, but some plot holes and loose ends remained which should have either been tied up or cut off. The movie, definitely brings in a new sense of purpose into the art of scientific story telling.

HALDIGHATI: The Valley of Courage

Recently, I visited Haldighati near Udaipur in the state of Rajasthan with my parents. I went there via road and it took me 2 hours from Udaipur to reach there. Haldighati is a mountain pass situated in Aravalli Range of Rajasthan district in Rajasthan. The name 'Haldighati' has originated from the turmeric-coloured yellow soil of the area. I collected some stones from this place. I was shocked to see that when I washed the stones, they became dark Yellow in colour. Local people say that the soil is dark yellow in colour because of the blood of the soldiers who died in the battle of Haldighati fought in this area. But the actual reason why the soils are yellow is because of the presence of a mineral called Lithosol in the area.

The Battle of Haldighati was a battle fought on 18 June 1576 between the Mewar forces led by Maharana Pratap, and the Mughal forces led by Man Singh I of Amber. More than 1000 soldiers were killed in this bloody battle. It was significant because the commander of Maharana Pratap was a Muslim - Hakim Khan Sur and the commander of Akbar was a Hindu - Man Singh I. Further the battle of Haldighati has great significance in history as Maharana Pratap's army consisted of local Bhil tribesmen who were fearless hunters and experts of guerrilla warfare. I was surprised to know how advanced techniques of warfare were in the past!

The battle was so fierce that the field in which the battle was fought was covered in blood. After the seven hour long battle, the rain caused the field to become a pool of blood. Today, that field is known as Rakt Talai in the Khamnor area. When we went to Rakht Talai, it was mid afternoon and the site was completely deserted. We felt a bit eerie ... as if the souls of the dead soldiers still hovered there!

The legendary horse of Maharana Pratap - Chetak also died in this battle. It is believed that Chetak jumped over a 22 feet long river and came to safety with an injured leg. The Chetak Smarak at Haldighati marks the spot where Chetak supposedly fell. I saw the chhatri built on Chetak's tomb which is a finest example of man's love for pets!

I think this battle is the perfect example of Nationalism. Maharana Pratap and the people of Mewar never surrendered to Akbar. They wanted to be an independent nation. Later during the Indian freedom struggle, Maharana Pratap's courage and love towards the country encouraged nationalists like Lala Rajpat Rai, Rani Lakshmi Bai and many others to fight for the freedom of India.

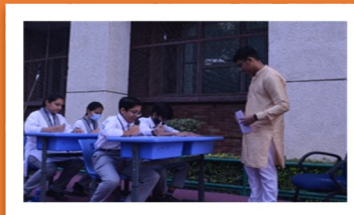
Theme was chosen keeping in mind the vision of our honourable Founder President Sir as we aimed at celebrating Founder's Day.
