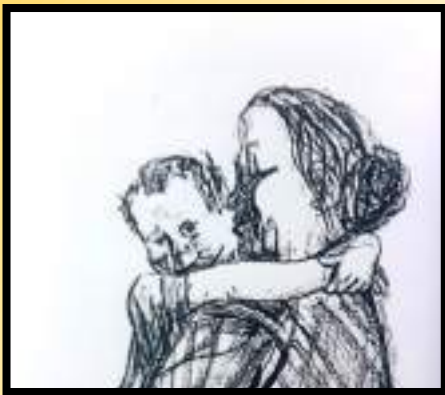

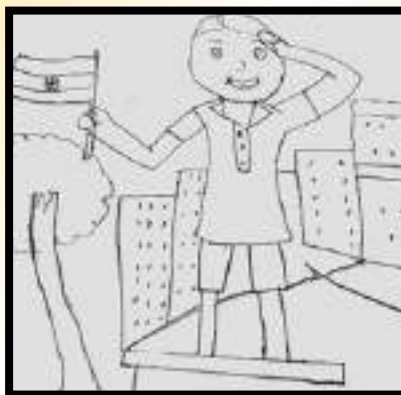

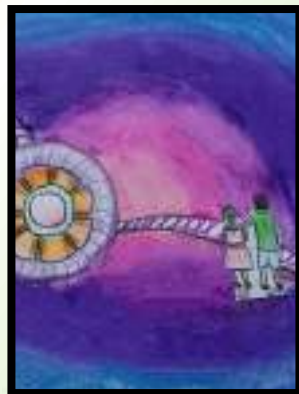

## Eco School Green Flag Award

Amity International School, Mayur Vihar has been awarded the prestigious Eco School Green Flag Award and Global Sustainable School Certification for the years 2024-2026 by **Centre for Environment Education** under the Foundation for Environmental Education, a global sustainable programme that aims to raise students' awareness on sustainable development issues through classroom study as well as school and community action. This award recognizes the schools' exceptional commitment to environmental education and sustainable practices.

The school registered for the program in December 2023 which was followed by its implementation from January 2024 in which the Seven Step Methodology was adopted including formation of the Eco Committee, carrying out Environmental review, linking of activities to the curriculum, implementation of the action plan, monitoring and evaluation of the activities conducted, inform, and involve the parents and community and finally formation of the school Eco Charter. The final report was submitted on March 30, 2024. This was followed by a physical audit on May 16 by Dr. Renuka Rawat, ESP auditor from ASN School, Mayur Vihar.
