Words From The Wise





Inspiring Values To Emulate




Class V children visited Australia's oldest and famous zoo-Melbourne Zoo. They saw different animals living in the enclosures and also learnt some unbelievable facts about them.

Empirical Excellence


- Jaisal Kothari of class XII has been selected in the National round of the prestigious IRIS Science fair for his wonderful science innovation Flicker app.

Of those who came and sparked


The fancy of my age.






Are aliens really there?
