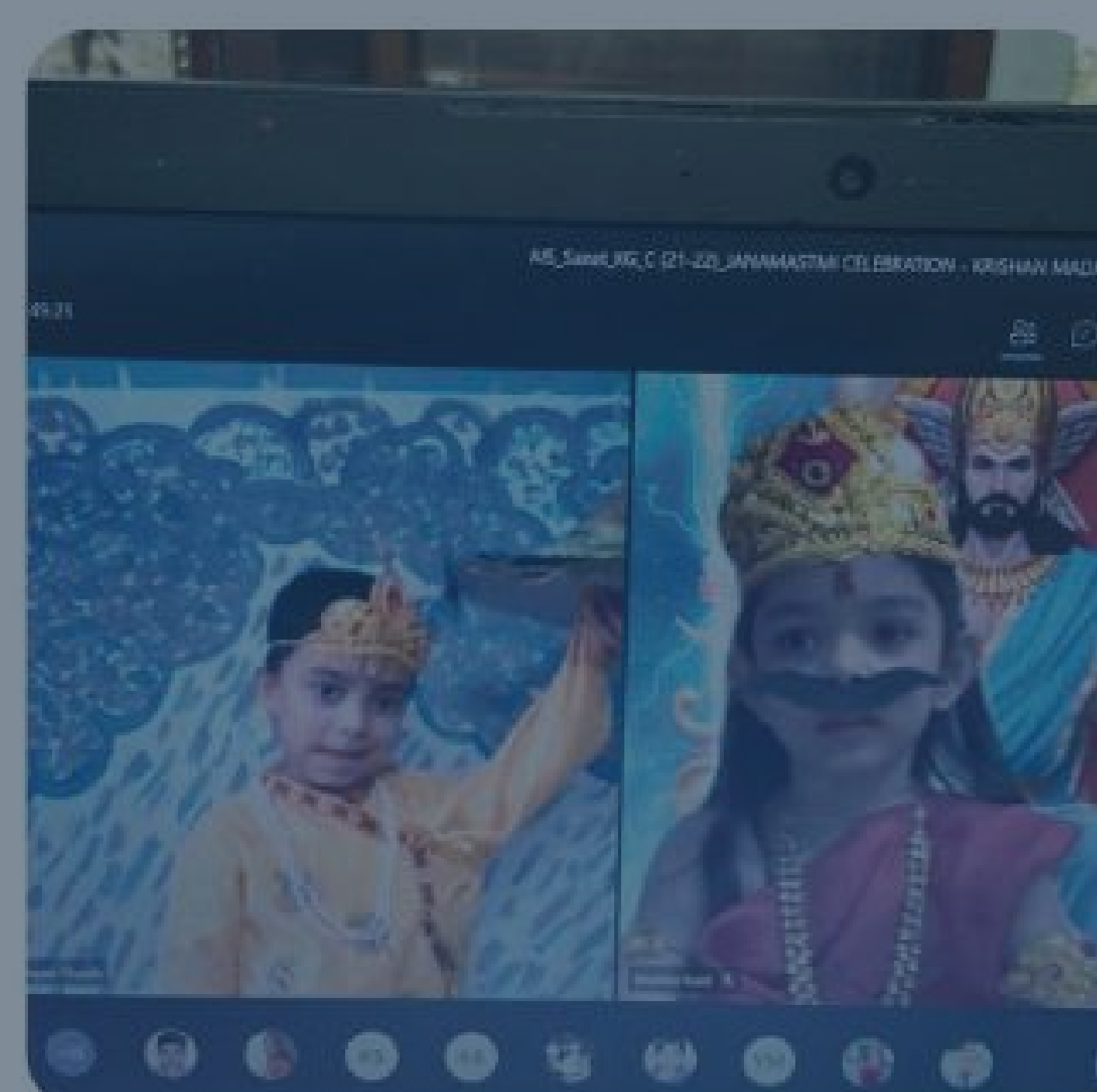
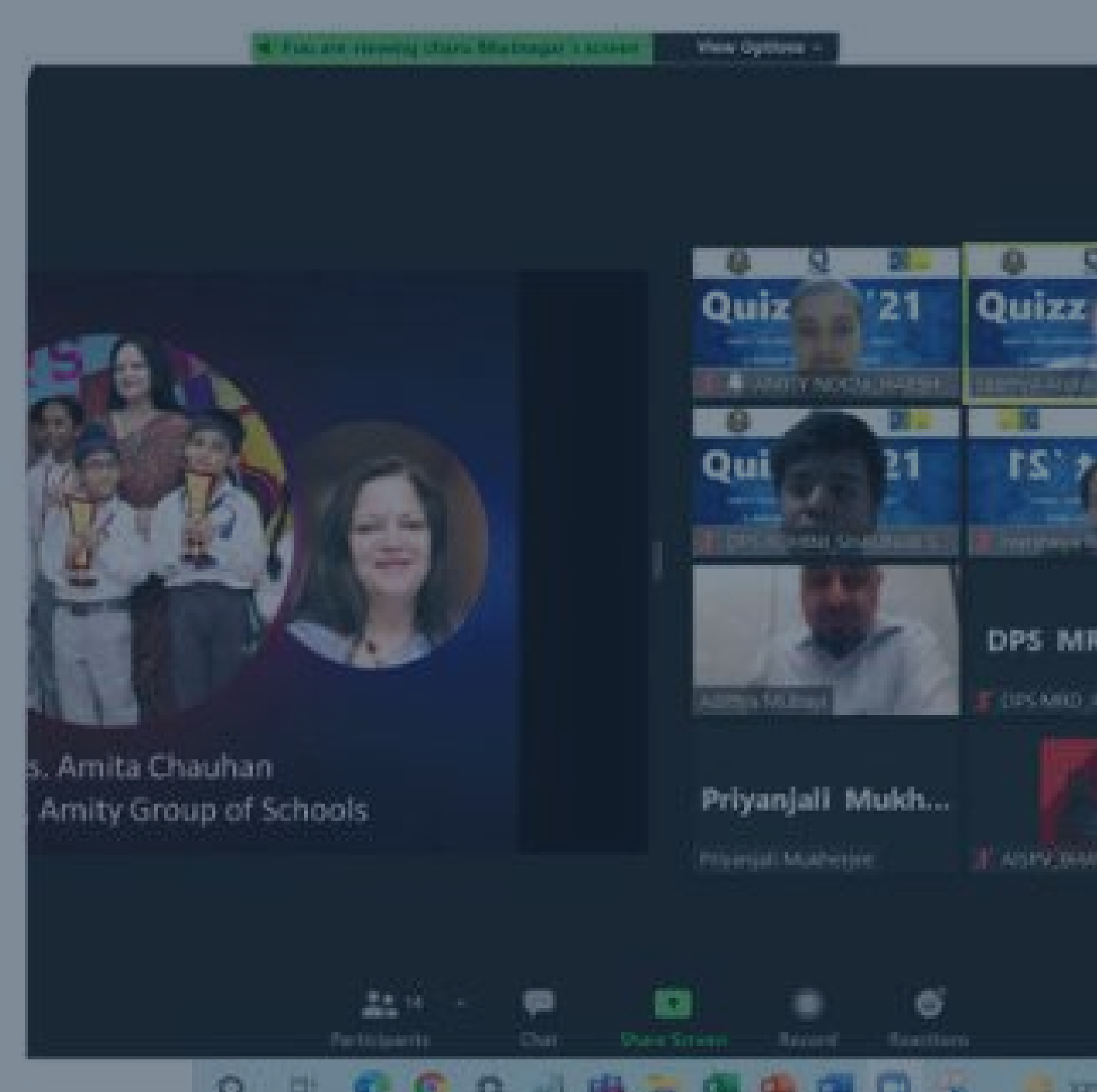

# “HAPPY TOOTH, SAD TOOTH” ACTIVITY

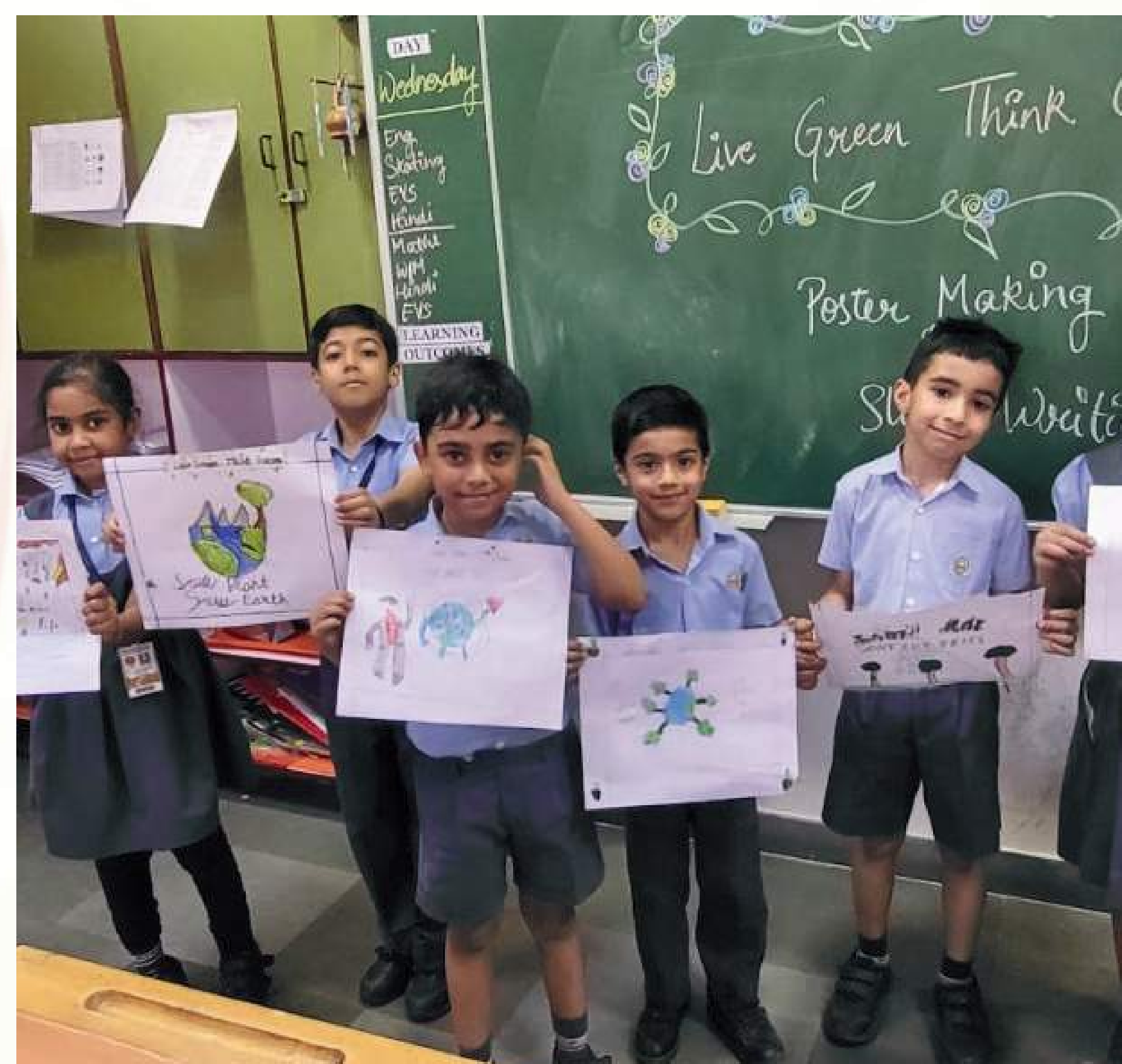

# 'BLUE DAY'

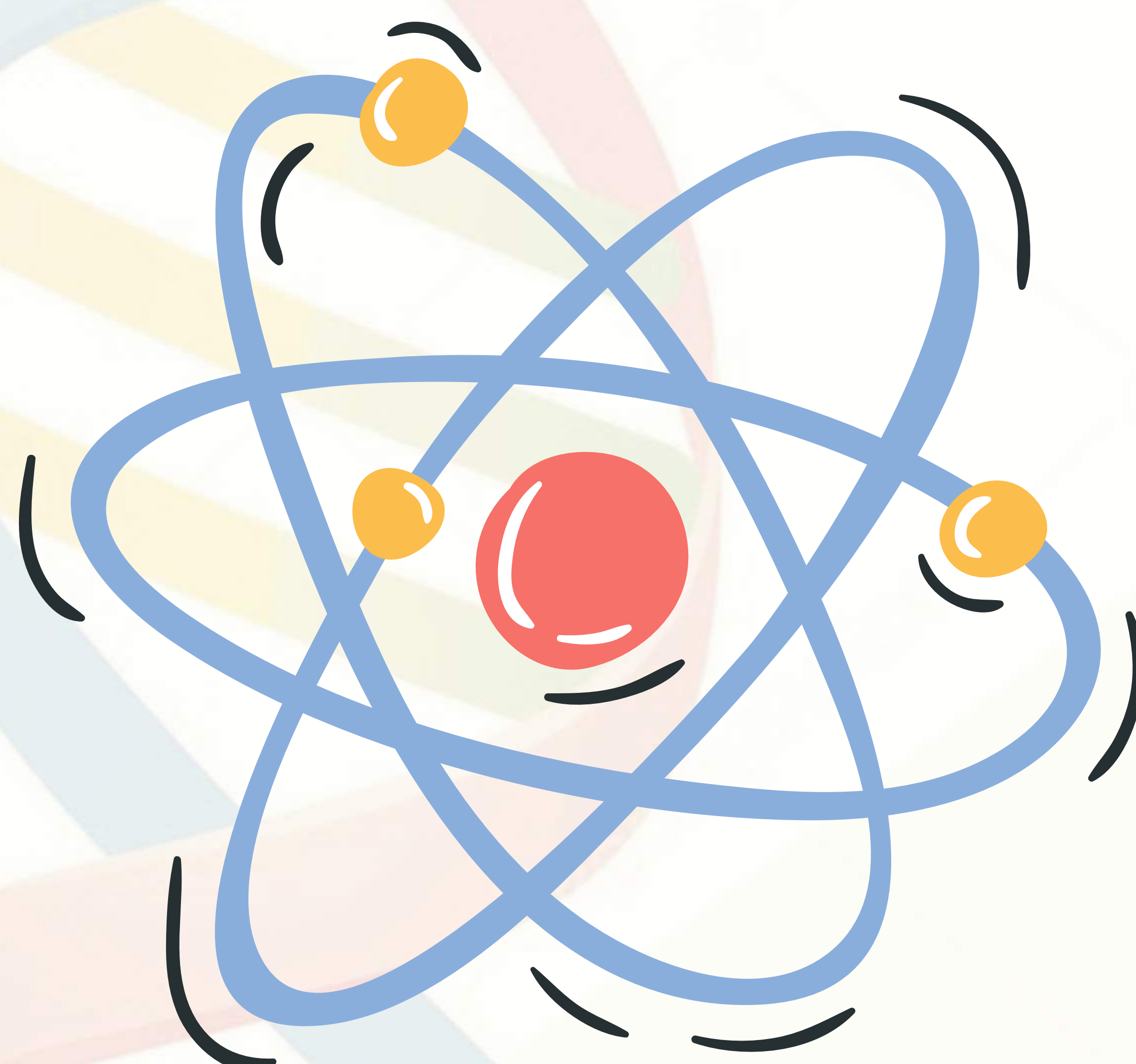

# JAMUN

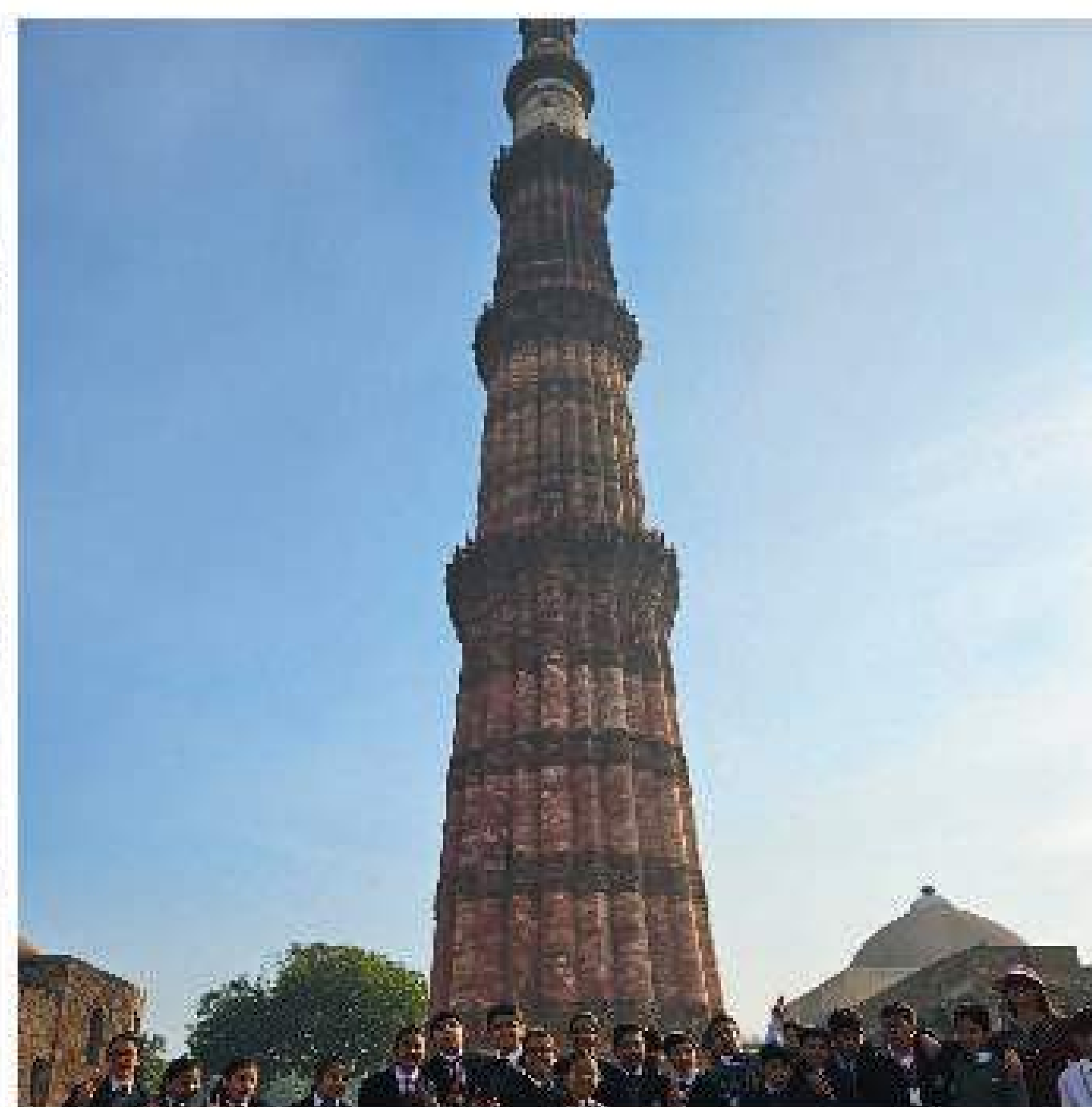

## *A Journey of Faith*

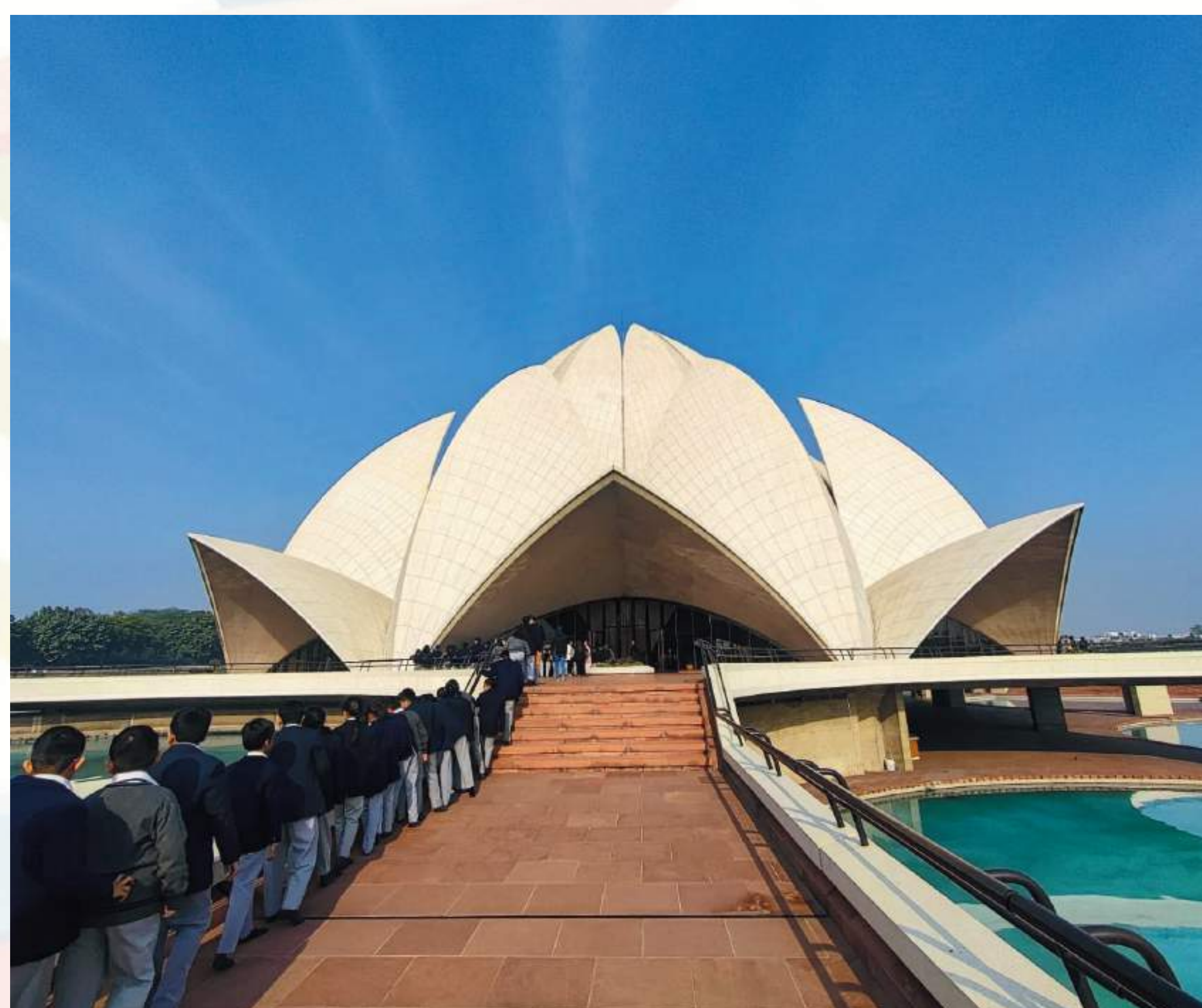

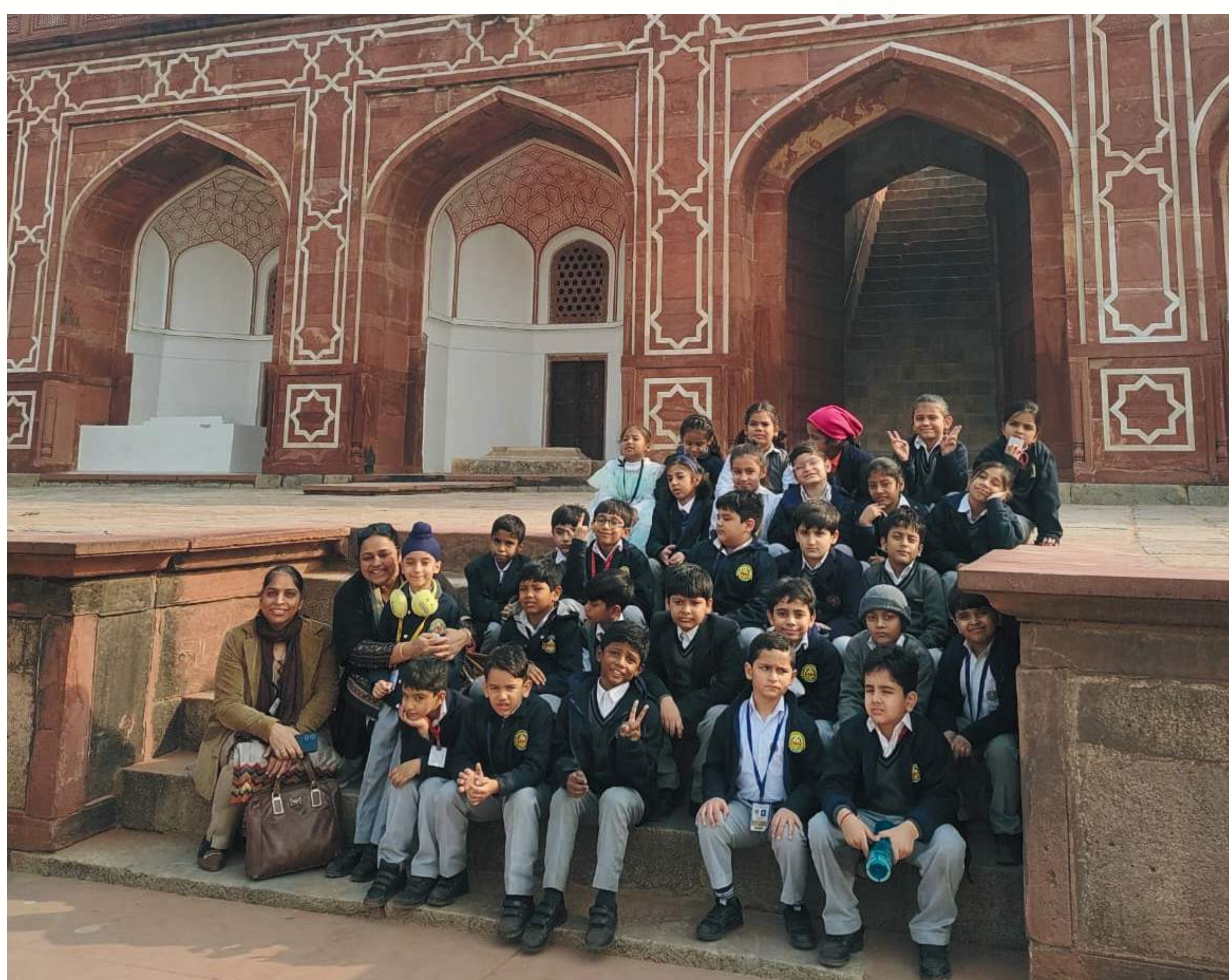




# EXCURSION TO HUMAYUN'S TOMB

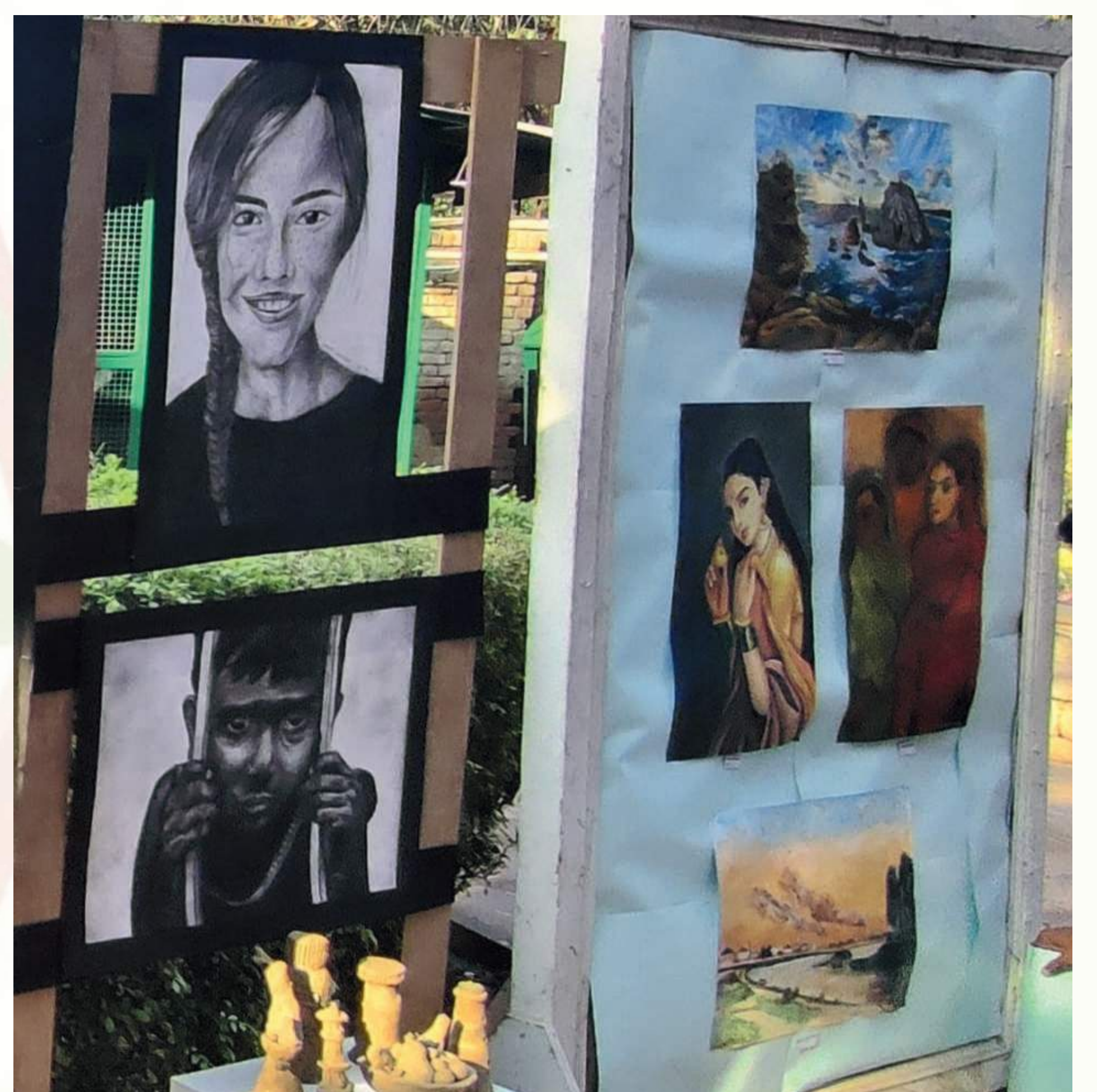
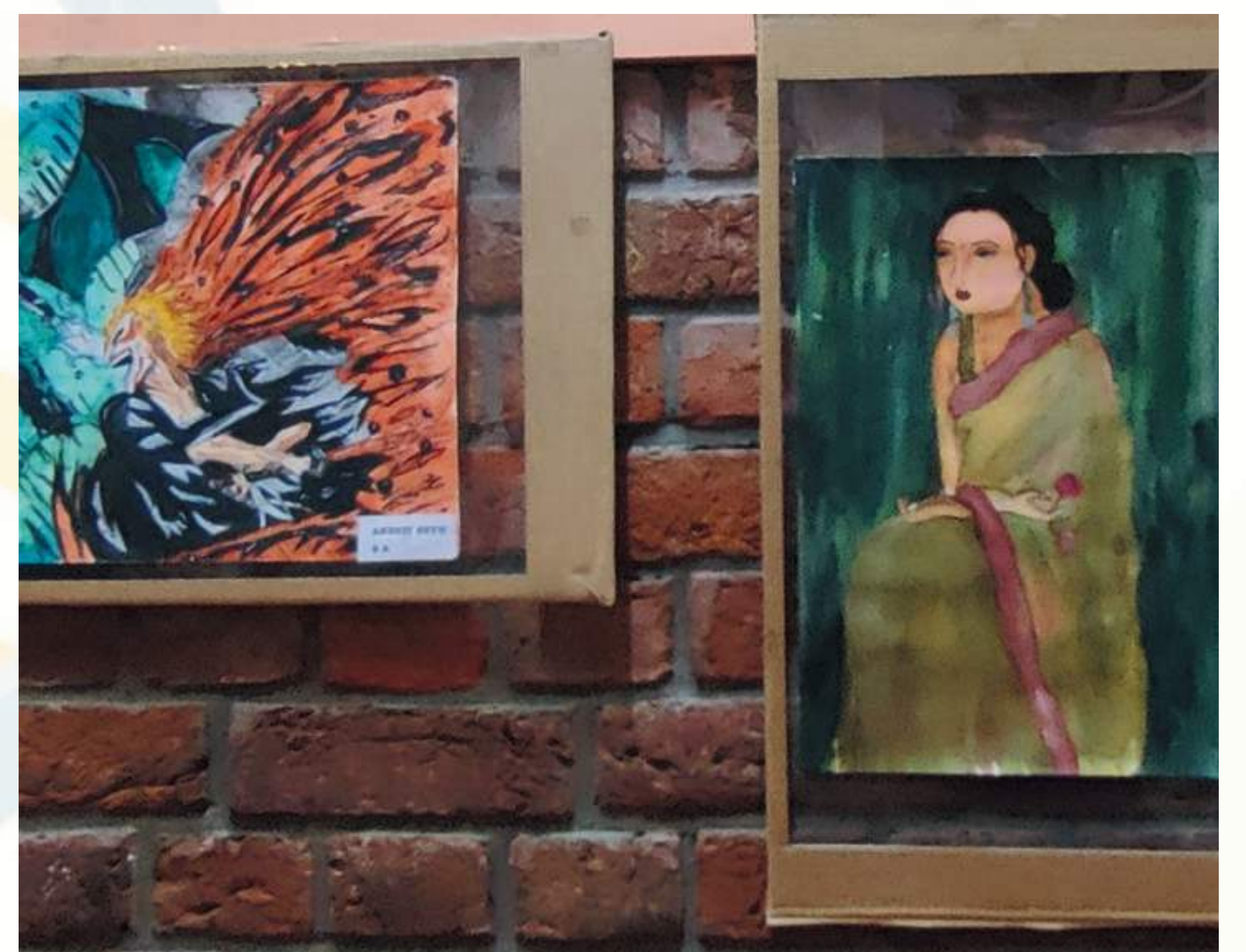


# ART EXHIBITION

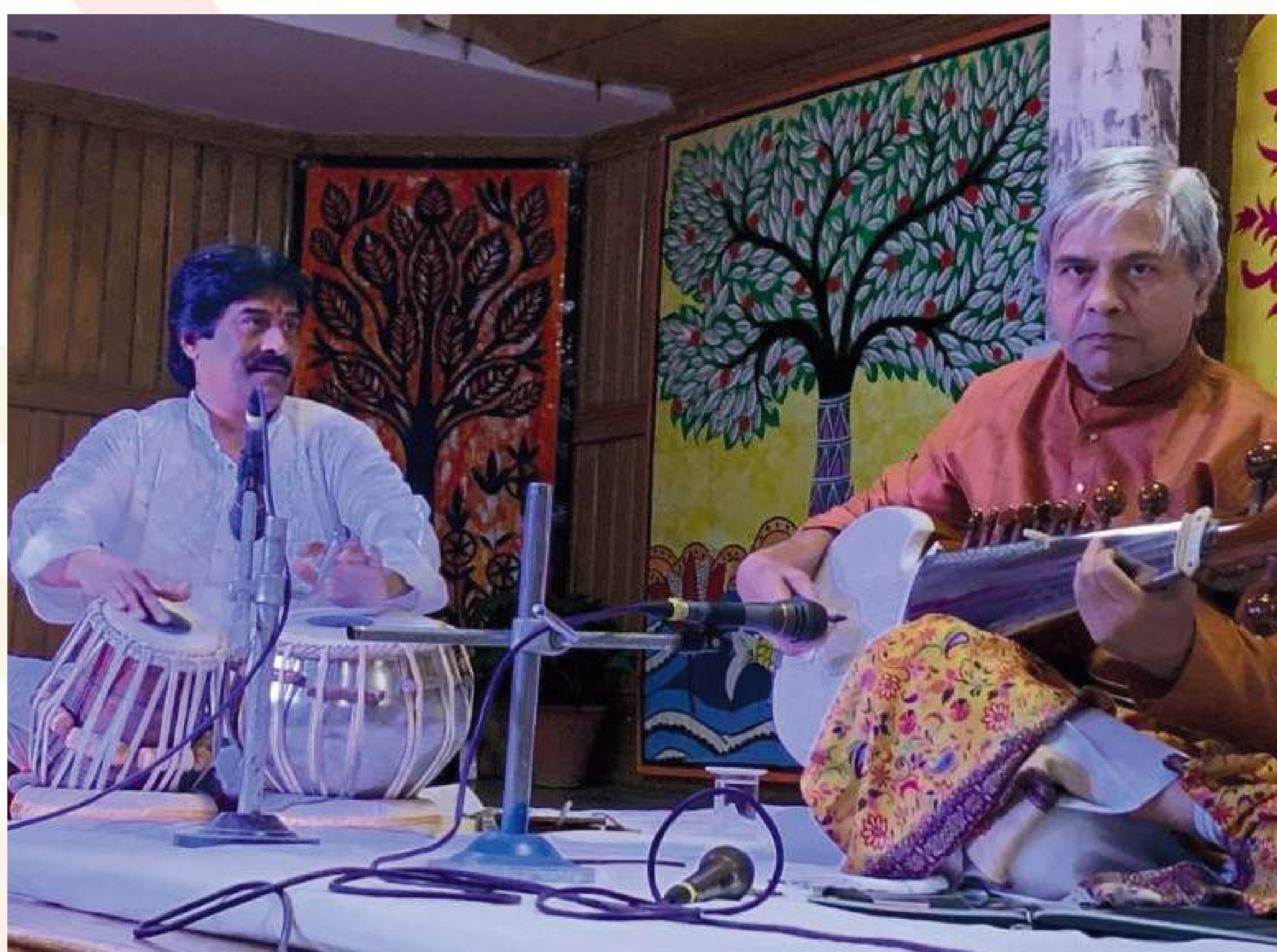


# SPIC MACAY

It was a mesmerising event, rooted deeply in cultural values, enjoyed by all students and teachers alike!

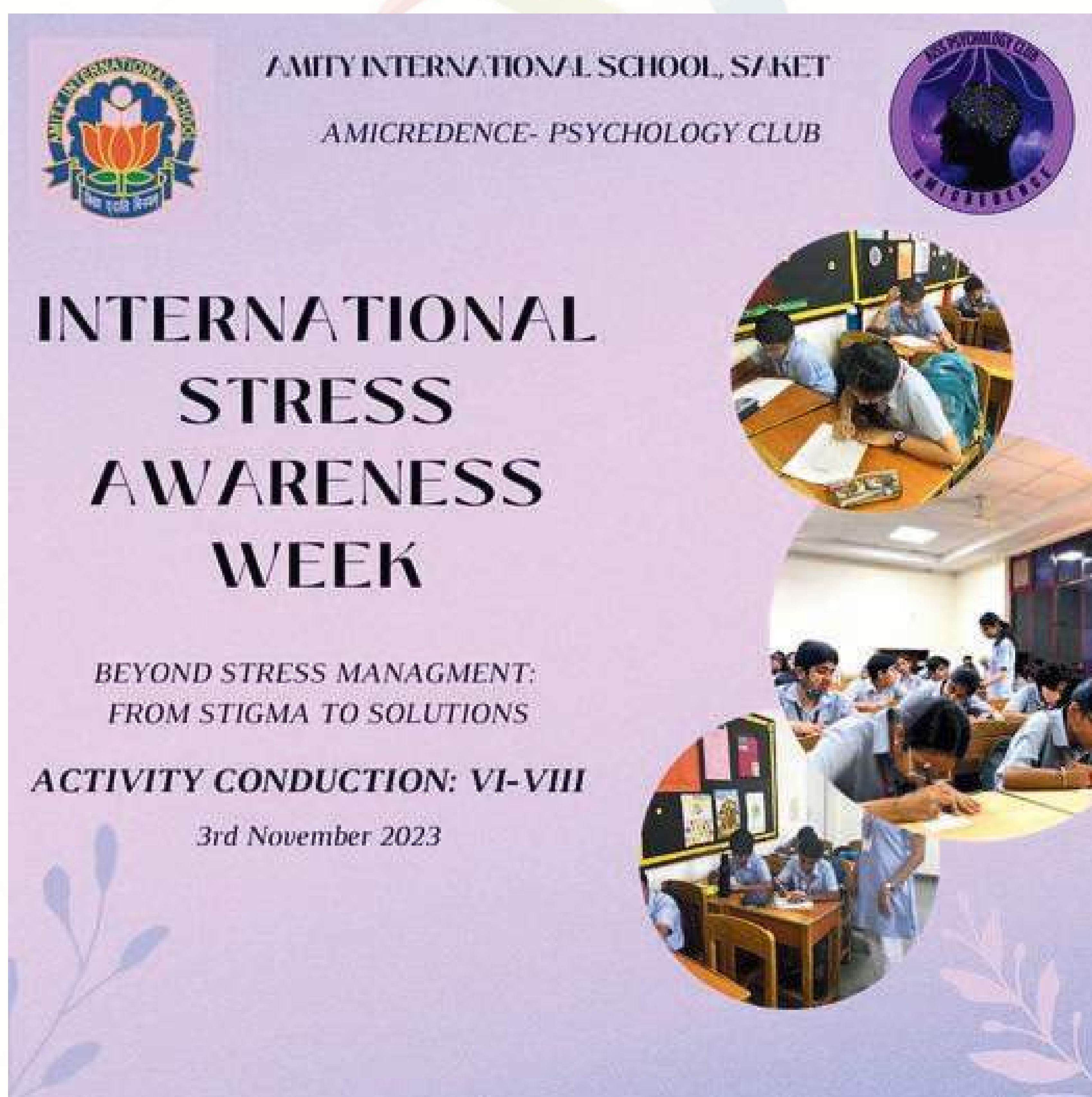




# INTERNATIONAL STRESS AWARENESS WEEK

AIS, Saket organised creative activities and interactive tasks for students in grades VI through VIII, which illuminated stress management techniques while stressing over the daily stressors in our lives.

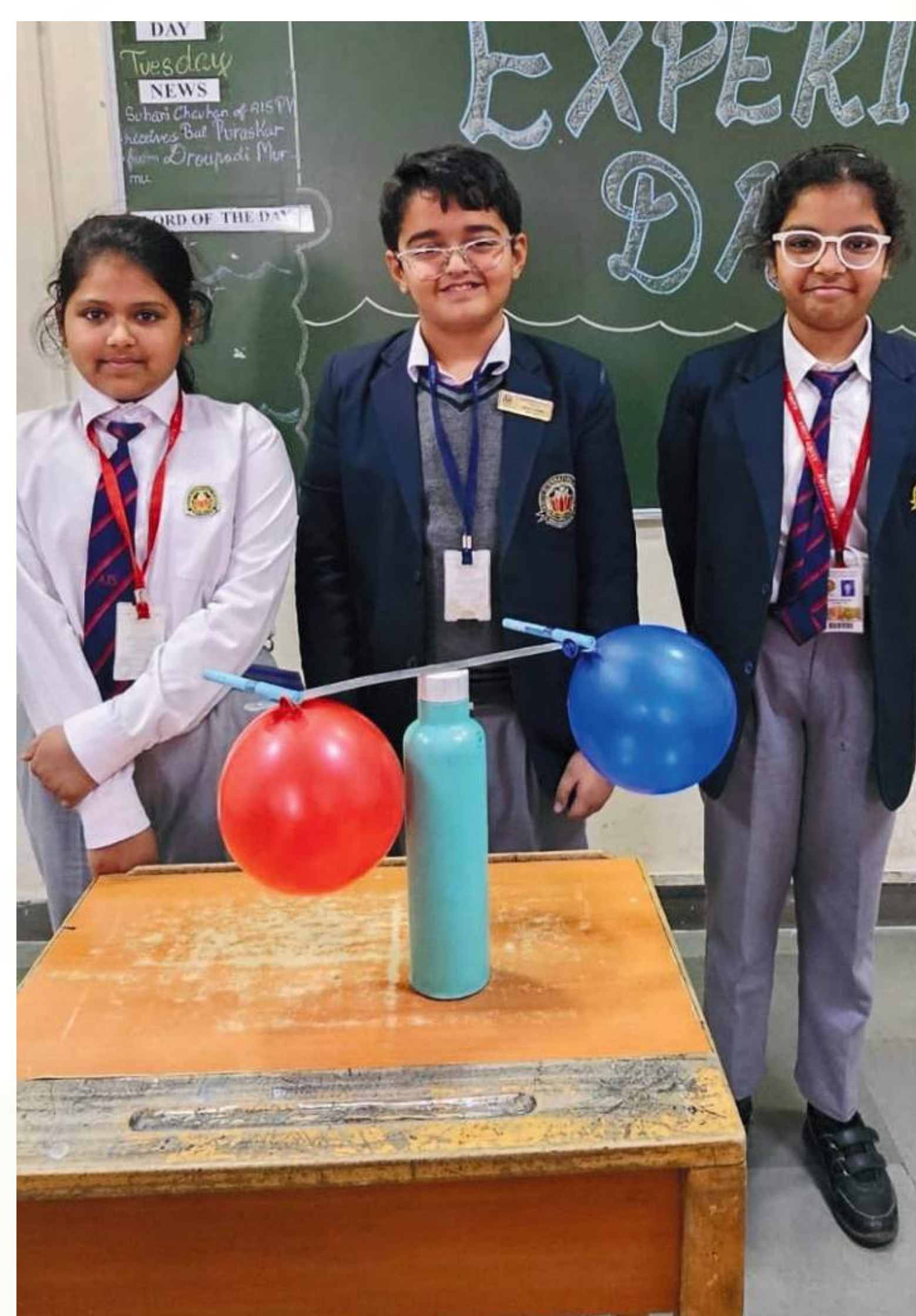




# NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY

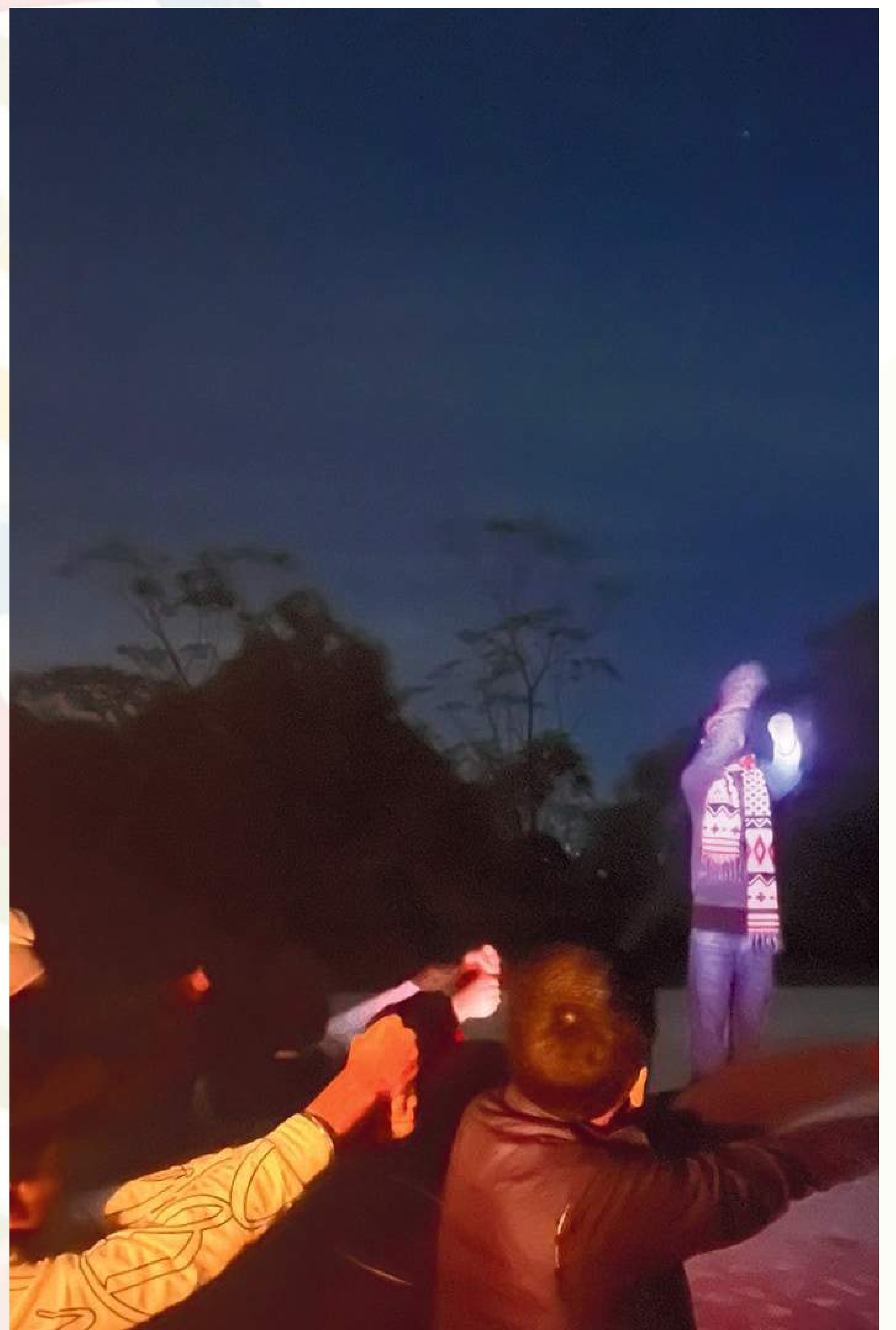




# ASTRONOMY CAMP TO SARISKA

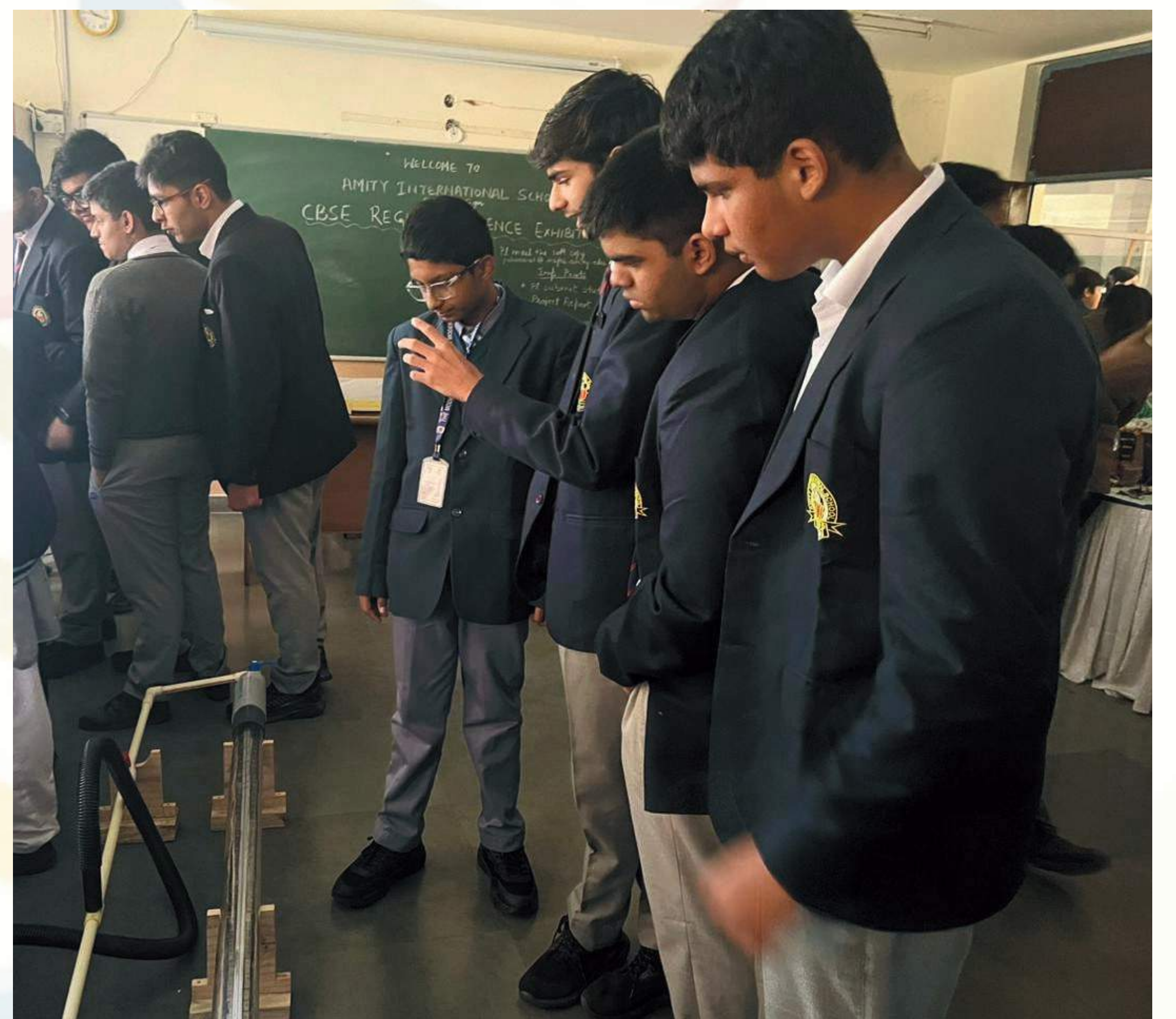




# SCIENCE FAIR CBSE

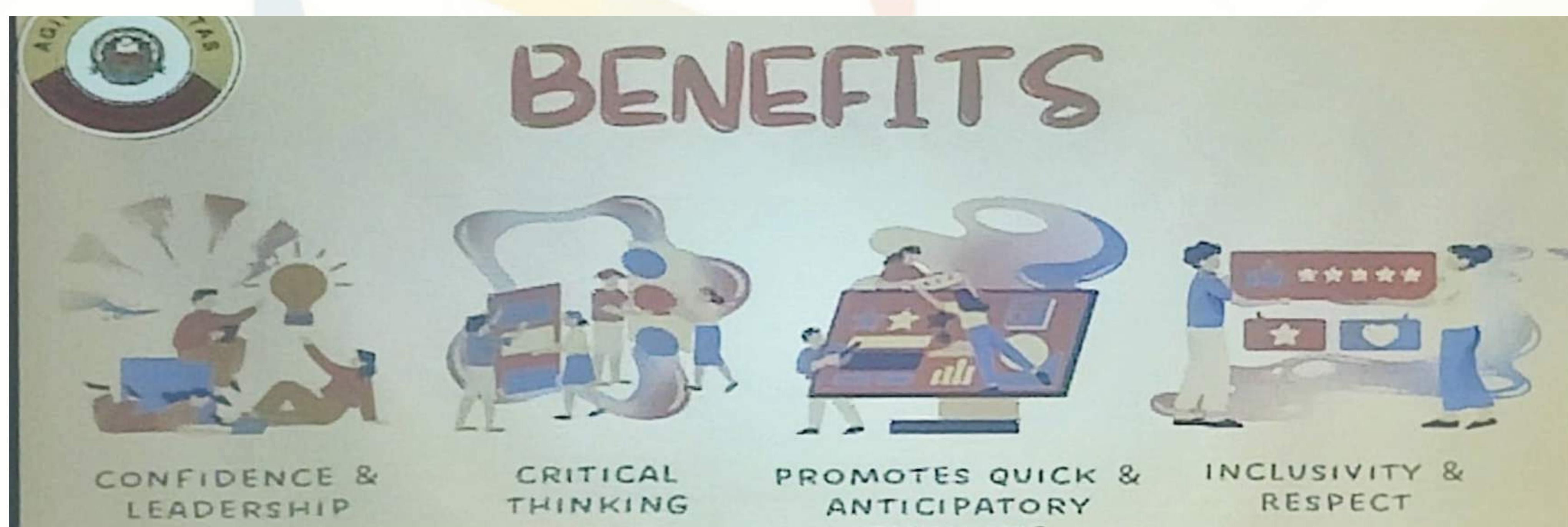
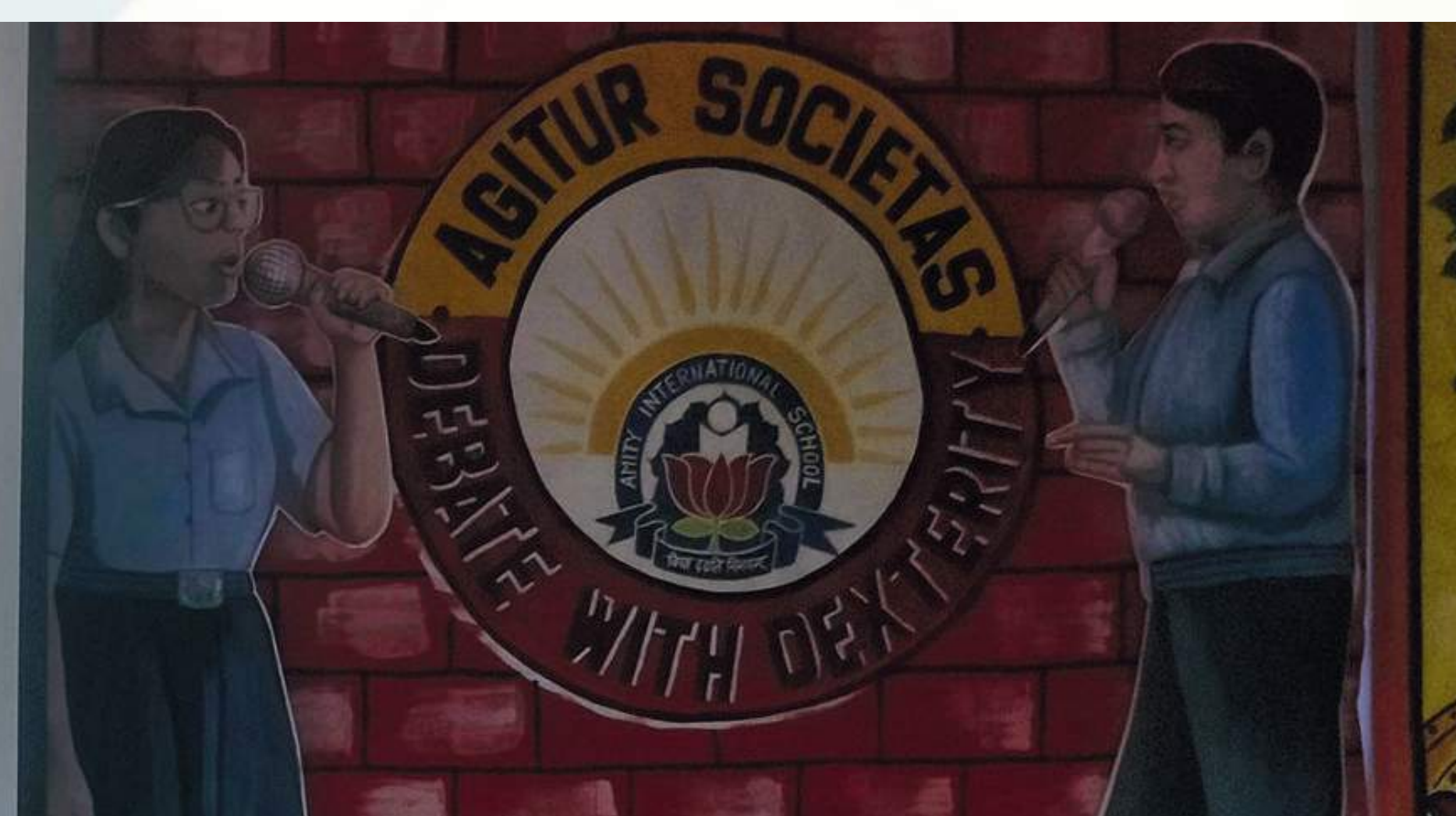
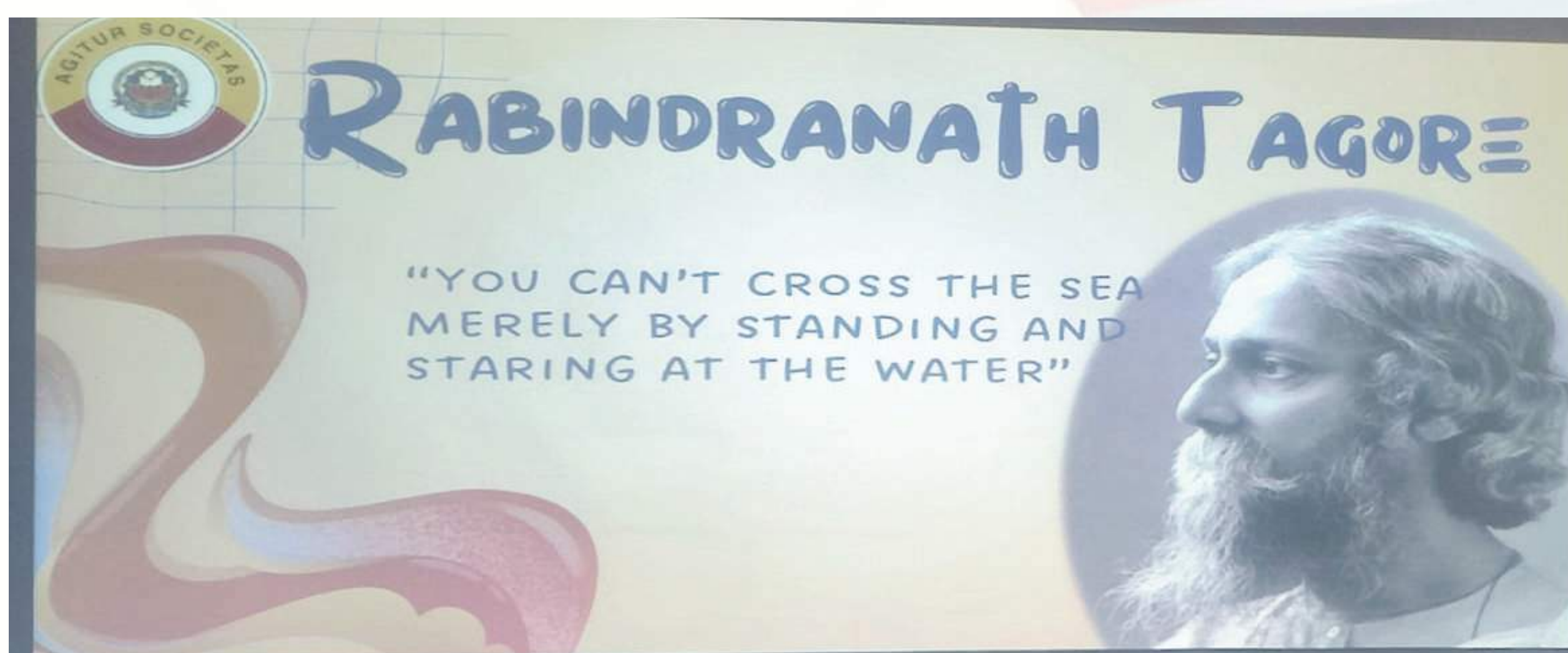




# TURNCOAT DEBATE WORKSHOP- AGITUR SOCIETAS

*Suddenly, the members of my tram flashed across my mind. They were 6 of them.*

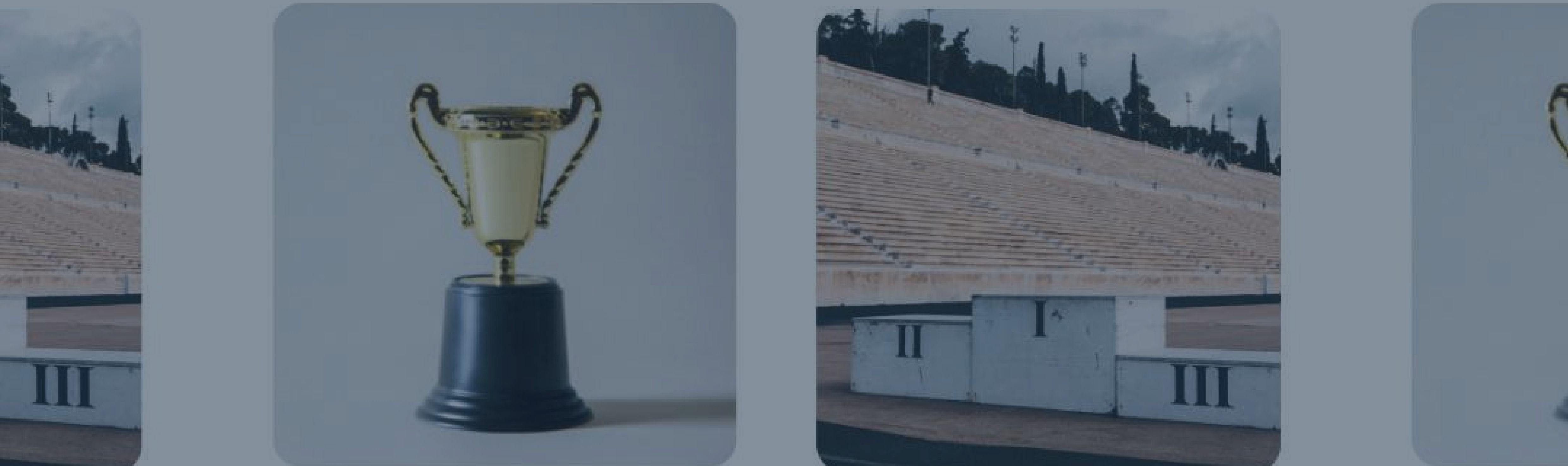

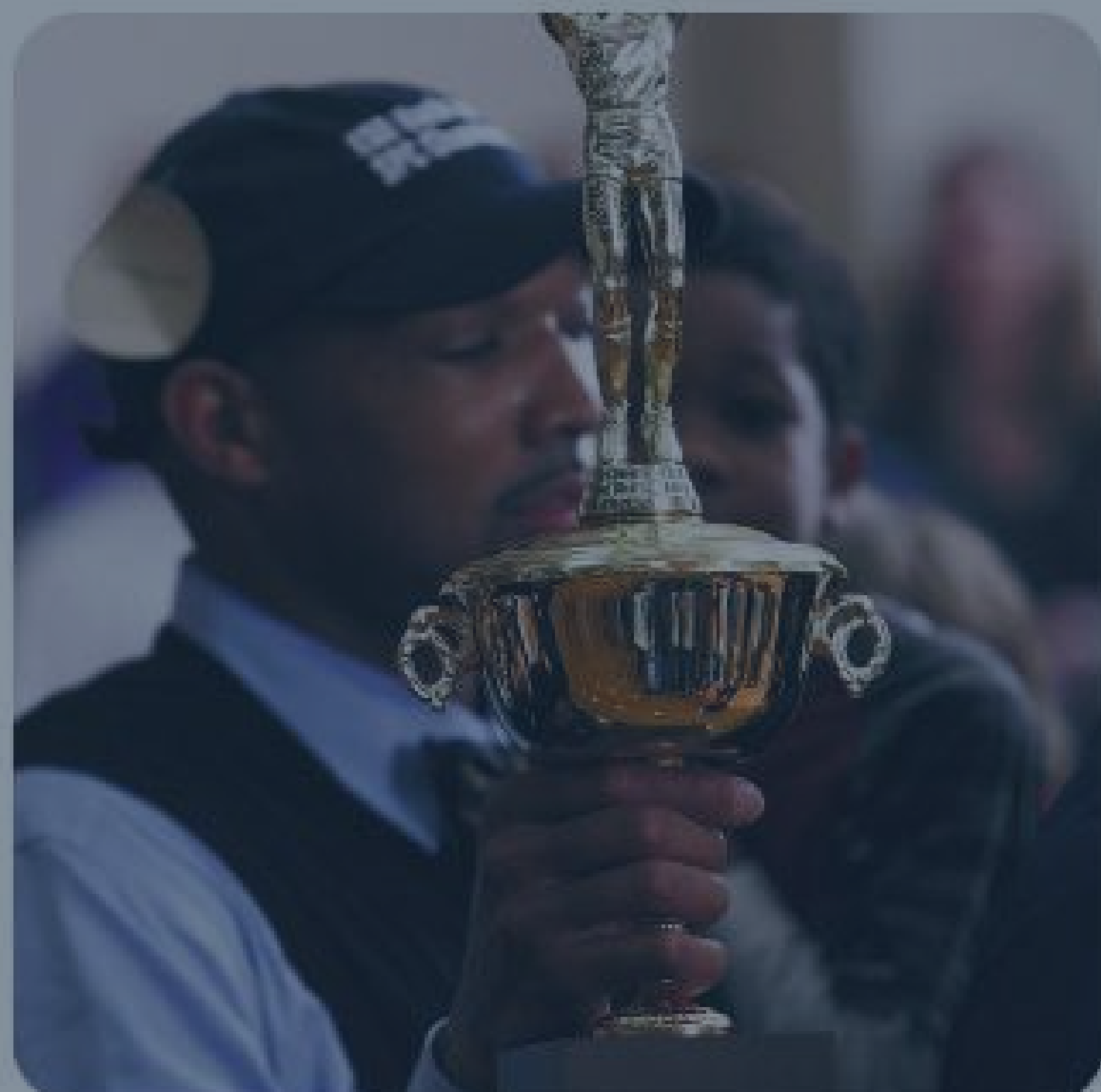

# MEGA KIDS CONTEST

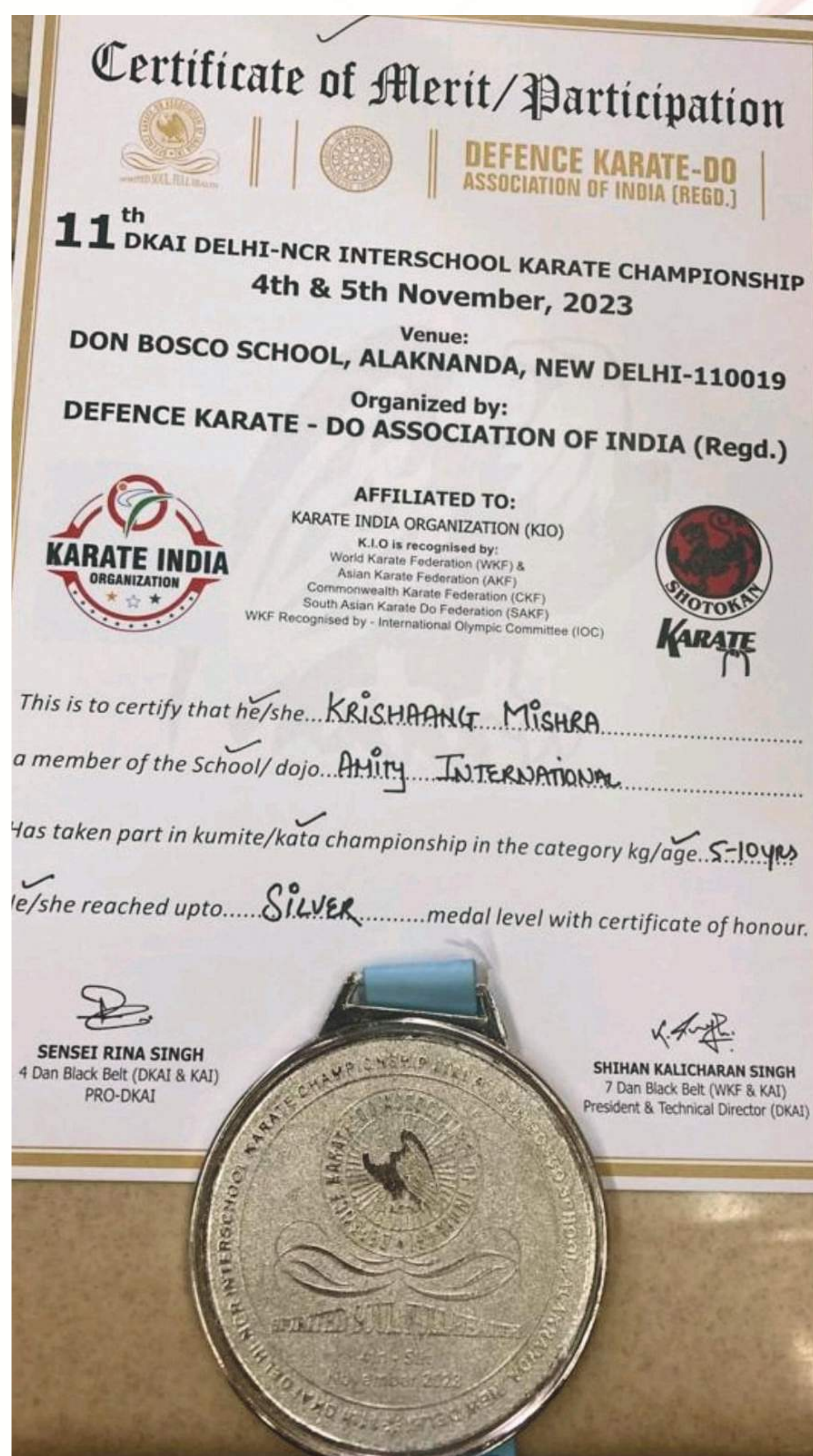
