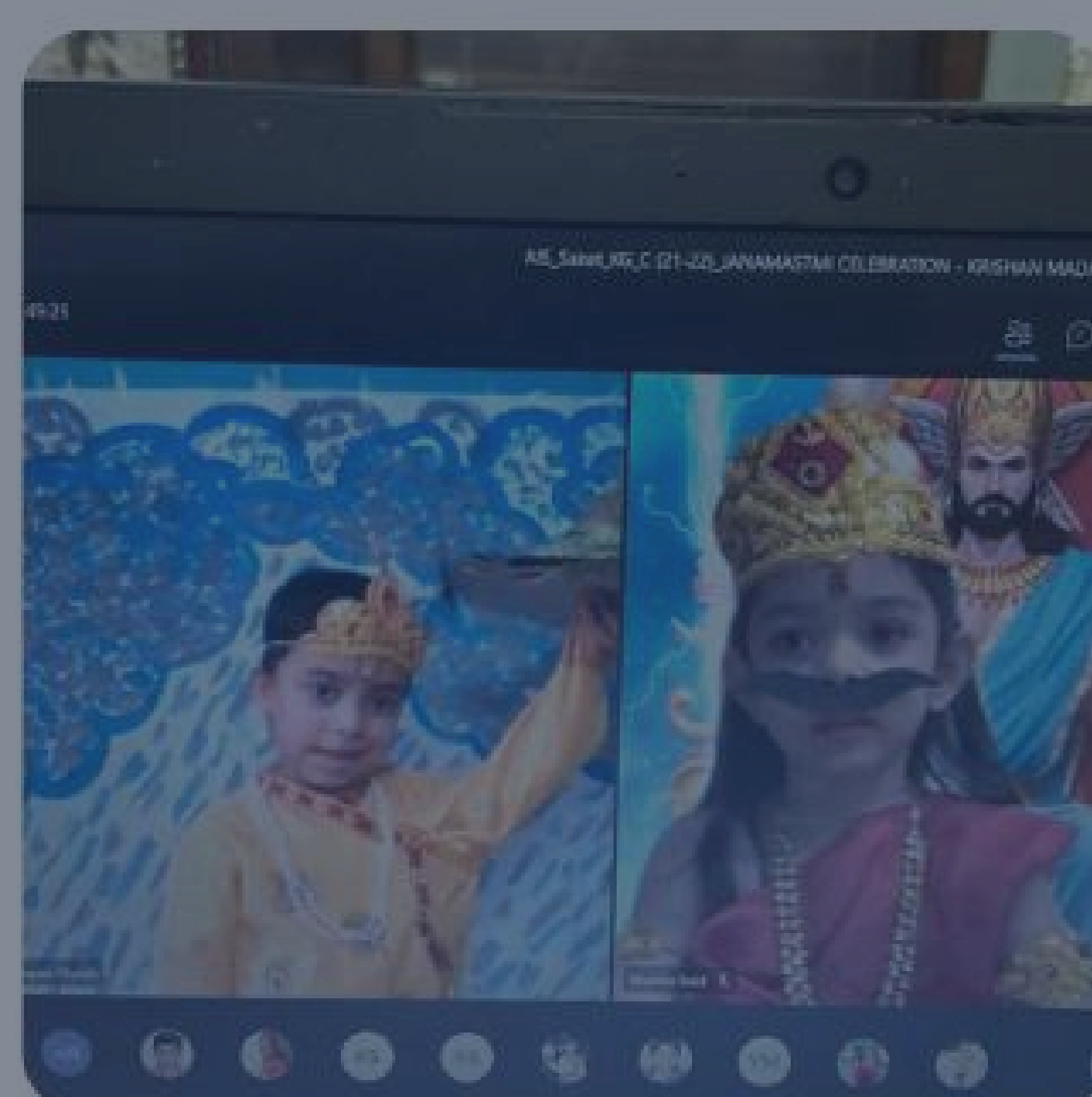
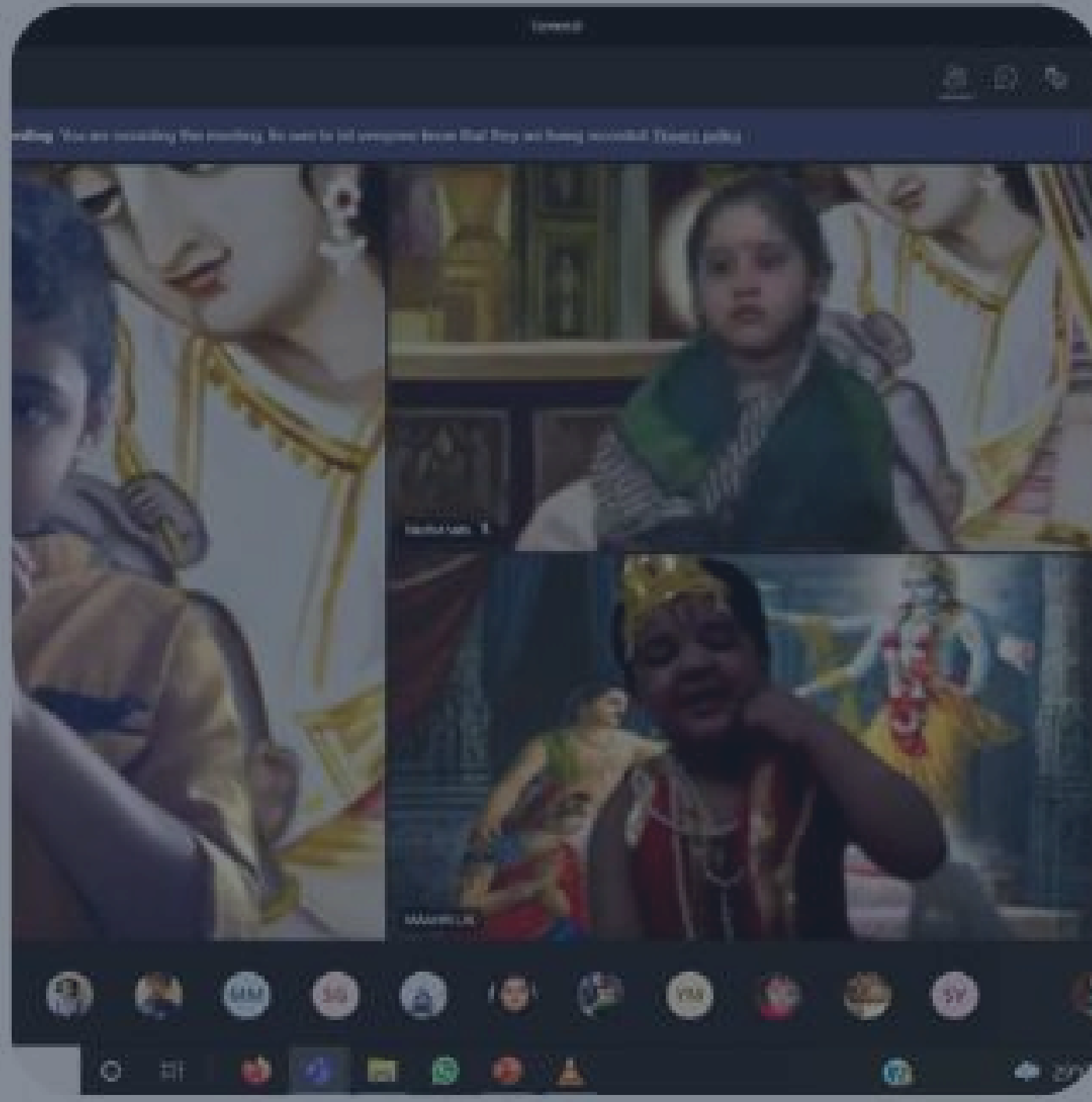
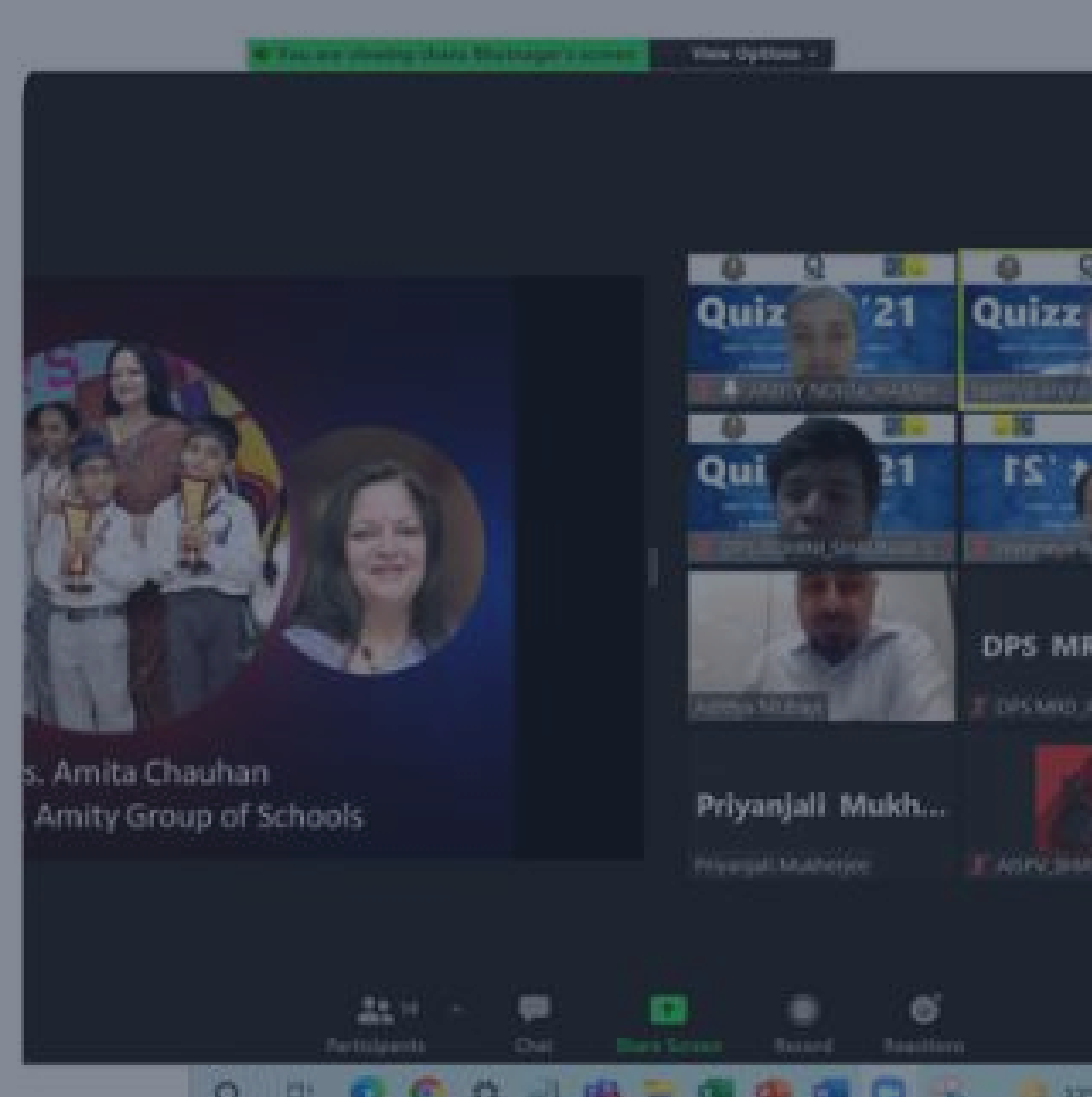

"Early Voices in Action!"

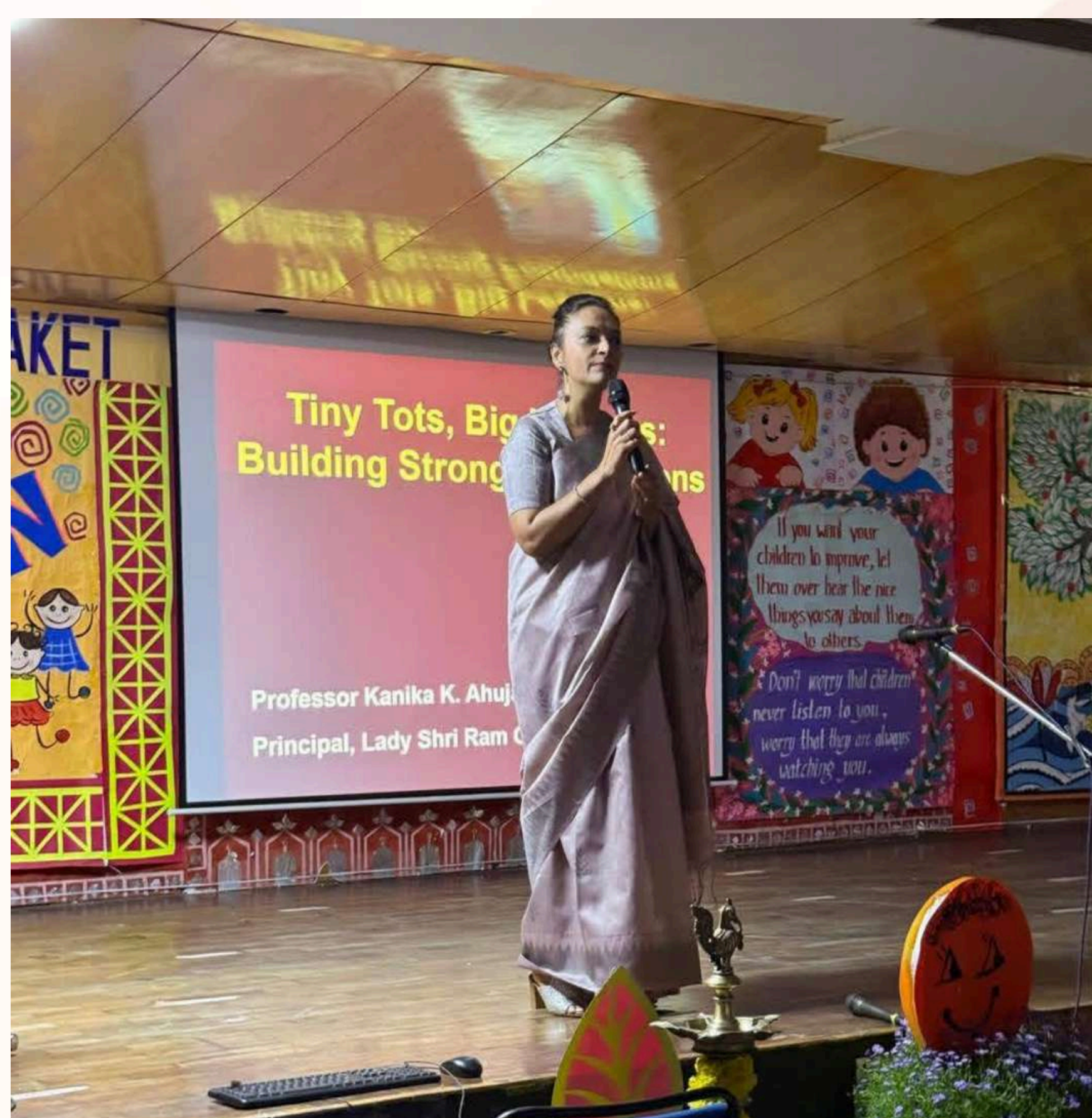

“Fashion Meets Awareness!”

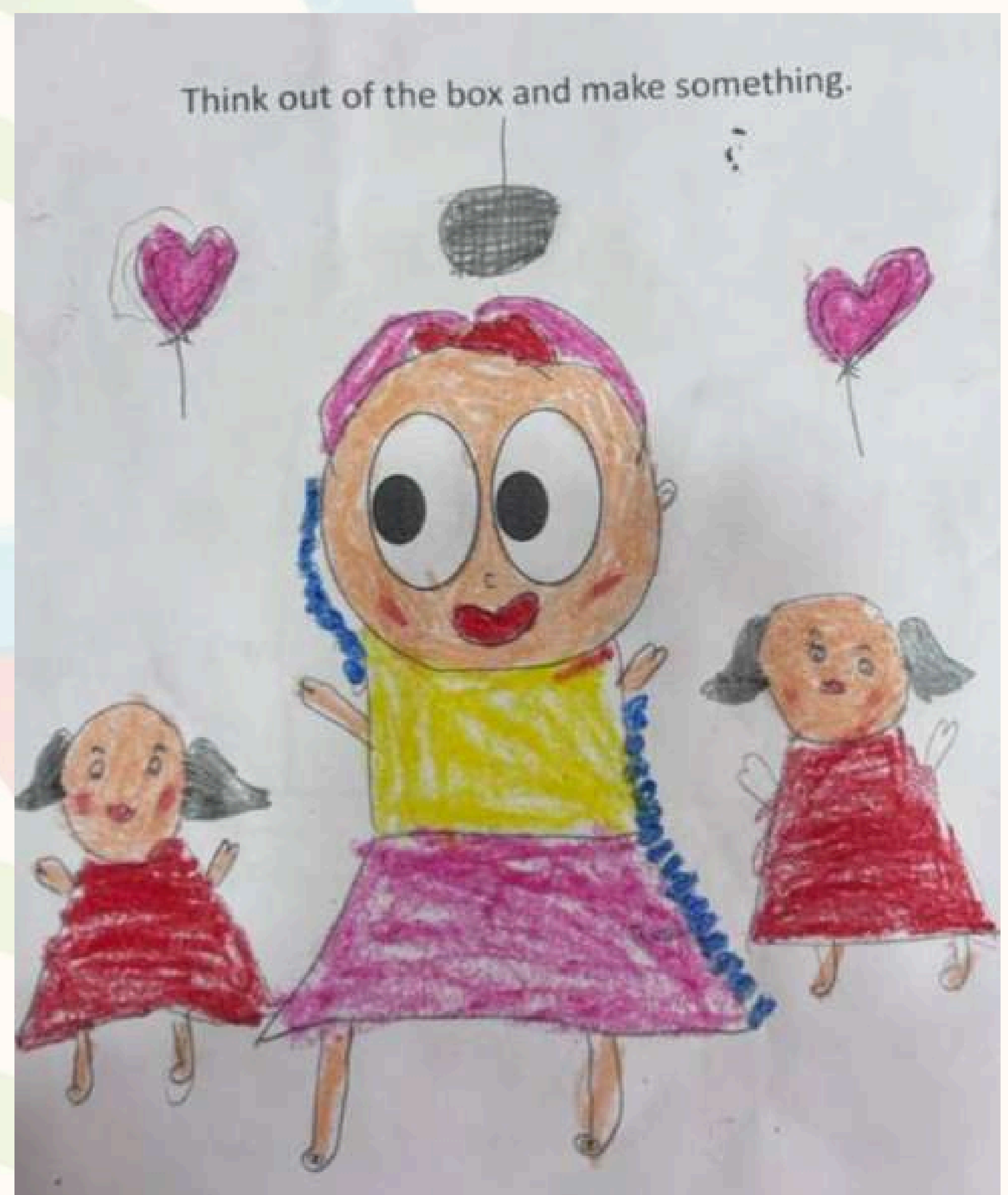
Students of Classes II, III, and IV walked the ramp with confidence, dressed creatively to spread awareness about environmental sustainability.

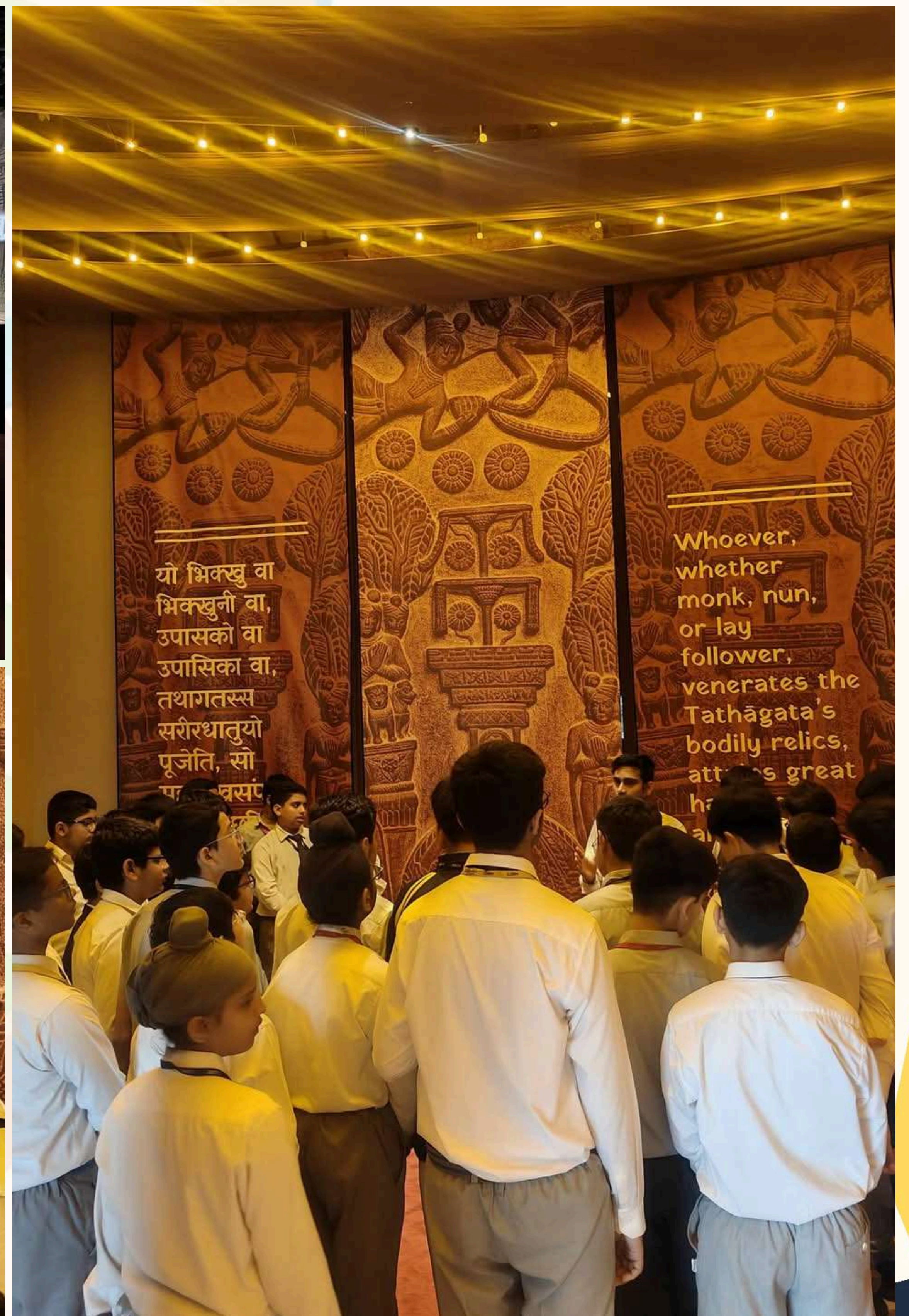
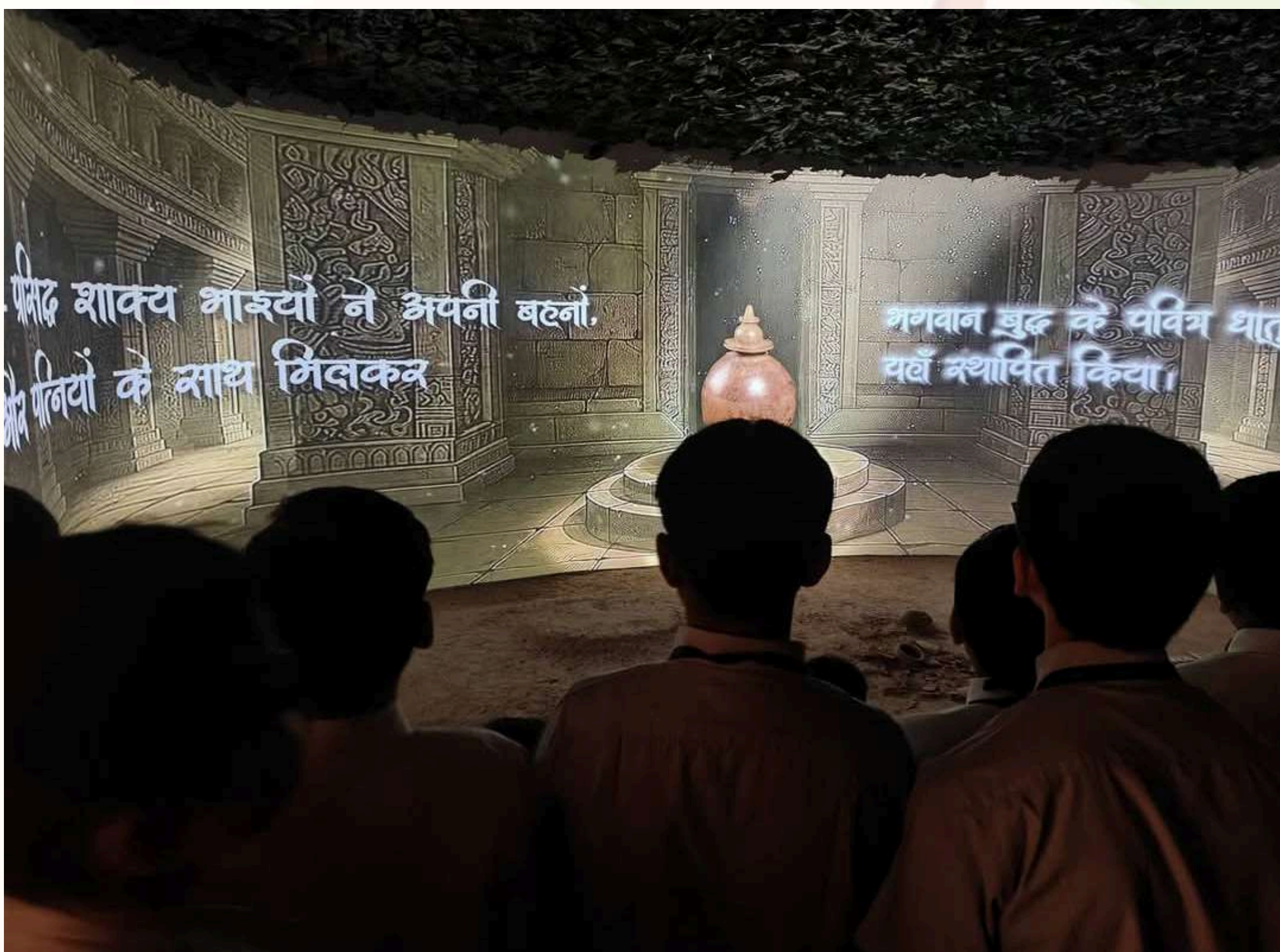
AMRIT UDYAN

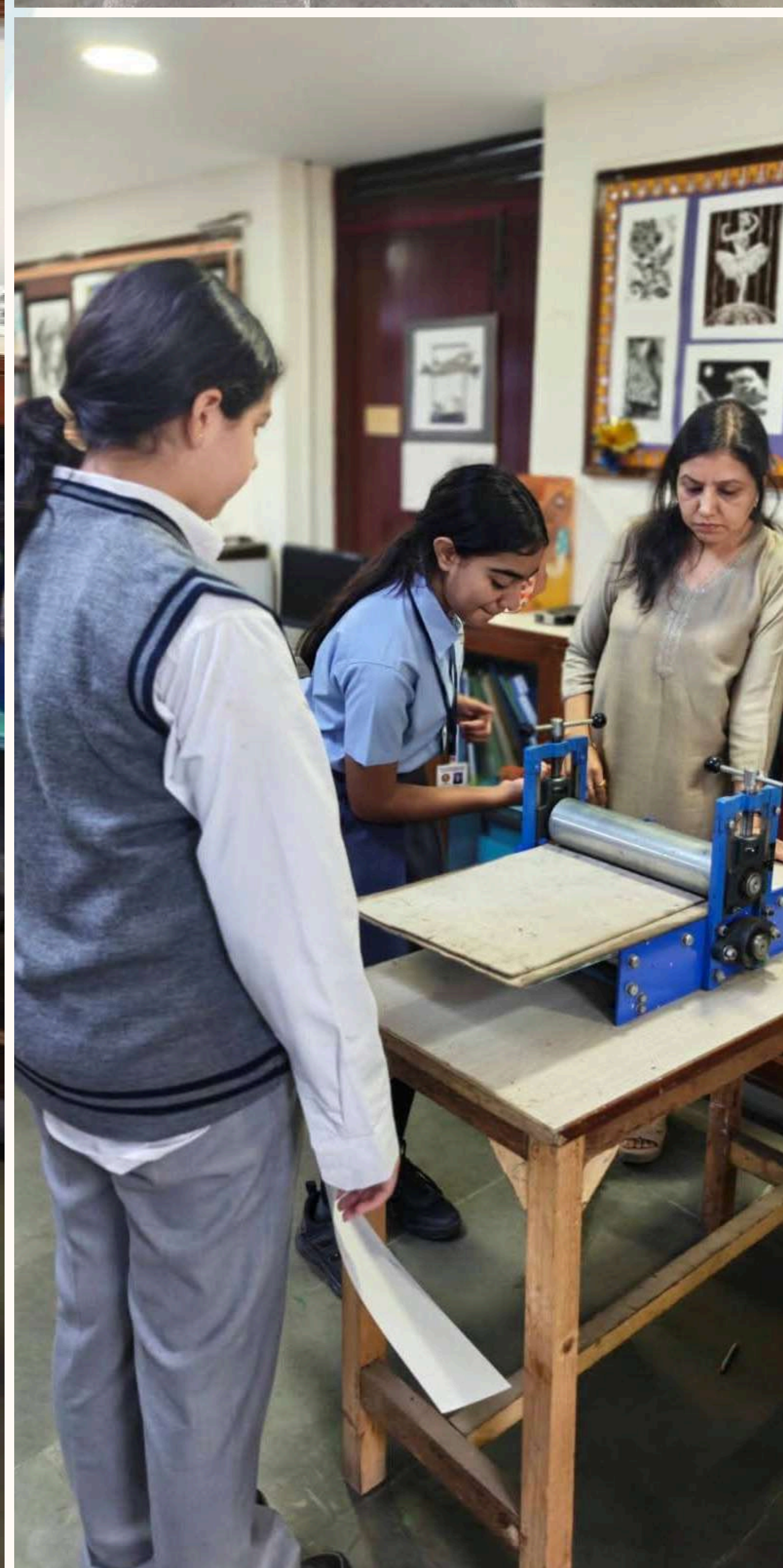
EDUCATIONAL EXCURSION

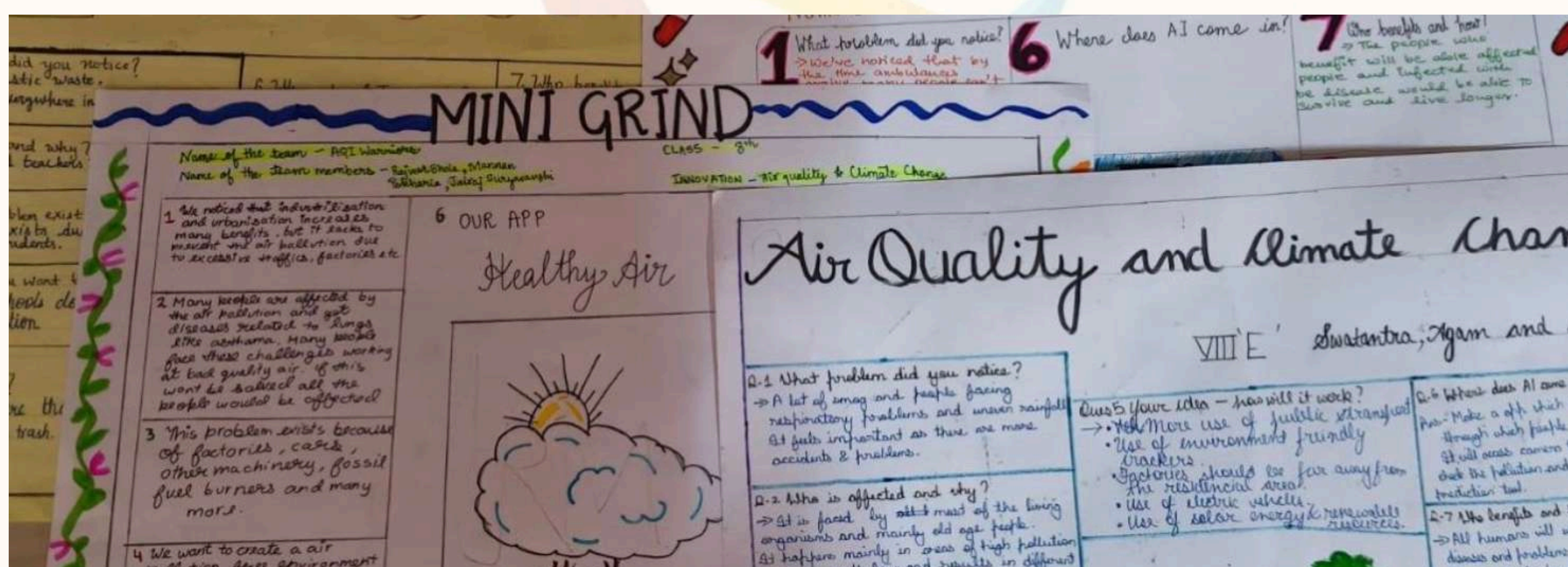

The citation ceremony of outgoing batch 2025-26 was held in march.

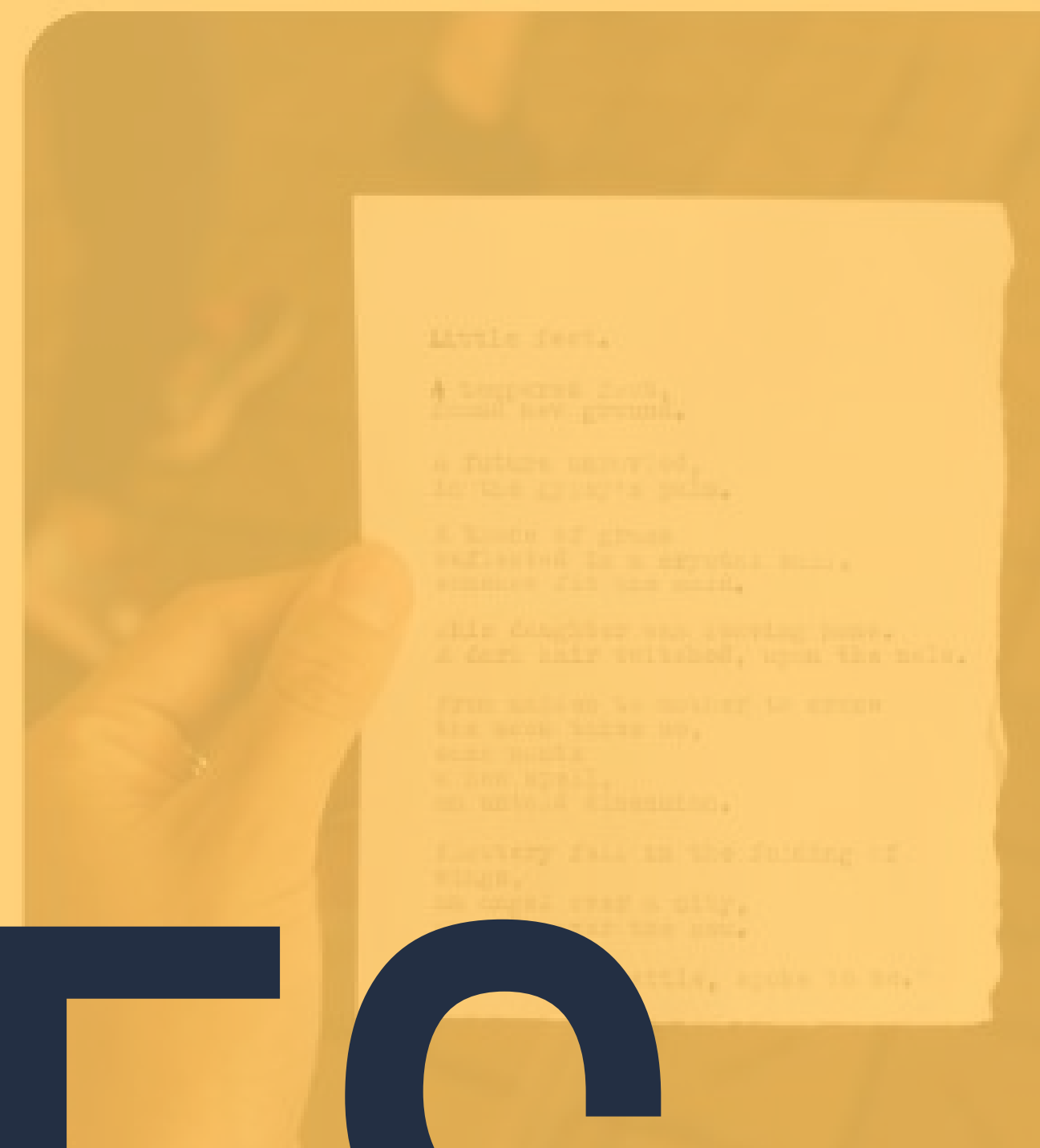
